




Just a word from Mrs. Stacy

Good morning children!!

I hope that you all had a joyous Easter!

Do you know what faith is? Can you actually see faith? I think the best definition of faith is the one found in Hebrews 11:1, "Now faith is the assurance (being sure) of things hoped for, the conviction (certainty) of things not seen." How can we be certain of things that we can't see? One example that I can think of is the air or oxygen. Can we see air? No, but we know that it's there because we can breathe and we can feel our lungs fill with oxygen when we breathe.

Can we see God? How do we know that He's there? Think back to Creation. The writer of Hebrews tells us in chapter 11 verse 3 that the universe was formed at God's command, and the visible (what we can see) was made from the invisible (what we can't see). The catechism tells us that although we can't see God, He can always see us. We believe in Him even though we can't see Him. The catechism also reminds us that God is a spirit and doesn't have a body like man.


Mr. Mac will give several examples today of things we have faith or believe in, even though we can't see it: when we cross a bridge or sit in a chair, when we turn on a faucet, or even when we fly in an airplane. What about believing in Heaven? None of us has seen Heaven, but we believe in the One who created it so we know it's there. What does your catechism tell you about Heaven?

The Old Testament stories of Noah and Abraham are stories of faith. God commanded these men to do some things that, at the time, seemed really strange. But these men had faith in their God and were obedient and God blessed them. Hebrews 11:1 says that they were "commended" for their actions. When we have faith in God, it pleases Him. Our greatest goal in life should be to live a life that pleases God by having faith in Him and being obedient to Him. I hope that you'll listen closely to Mr. Mac's sermon today.

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS



Meet Jim, Anna, David, Tikva & Esther Joy Serving in Asia

Jim is from Montgomery. His father attends Trinity Church. His parents supported missionaries through much of Jim's growing up years, so it is not surprising that he became interested in missions when he was in college. He works with a group of people who didn't have the Bible in their own language until Jim and several others started working on it.

Jim translates the Bible into their language so those people can understand it and have their own Bible. He also puts the Bible on a website so people can read and download it from the internet in their own home. Jim also writes songs in that language. Some of his songs are based on Psalms, which is a part of the Bible that was written for people to sing and pray to God. Their children are David (9), Tikva (7) and Esther Joy (4).
