




Good morning children!

It's almost summertime!! You're almost finished with school, and today we will celebrate your accomplishments during our Promotion Sunday Service.

I hope you're enjoying this sermon series about the life of David. We can learn so much by studying the life of David, and today Mr. Curles will preach from I Samuel 18:1-5 about the deep friendship between Jonathan and David. Remember in I Samuel 17, David begged King Saul to let him fight Goliath. No one thought that David would be successful because he was so young and Goliath was so huge and known as a warrior; however, David was able to persuade King Saul by reminding him that he had protected his sheep by killing both a lion and a bear! David knew that God would protect him from Goliath just like He had protected him from that lion and bear.


David was successful in defeating Goliath and saving his people from the Philistines. When David returned to King Saul to deliver the good news, Saul's oldest son, Jonathan, was very impressed with David and Scripture tells us that Jonathan and David became very good friends. They became such good friends that Jonathan gave David his own royal robe and weapons that included armor, a sword, a bow, and a belt. These are not just ordinary gifts, they are royal gifts with great significance. Saul was also quite impressed with David and put David in charge of his military operations, and David proved to be a very good leader. Scripture tells us that a bond developed between Jonathan and David. If you read on in chapter 18, you begin to see how deep their friendship was. King Saul became very jealous of David and his accomplishments and tried to have David killed on a few occasions. Jonathan, who was King Saul's son, helped David escape Saul's traps.



Meet Faith Radio Serving Montgomery and South Alabama

We walk by faith, not by sight. 2 Corinthians 5:7

This week's ministry is Faith Radio in Montgomery and six other locations in Alabama. Perhaps you have heard your parents listening to it or maybe you listen to Paws & Tales and Adventures in Odyssey that are on at 8:30 and 9:00 on Saturday mornings. Many of the programs include ministers and Bible teachers and Christian music. All of their programs are planned to encourage Christians and others who don't know Jesus to learn about Him.

Faith Radio is a "listener supported" station, which means they depend on donations from people who listen to the station instead of selling advertising like most stations do. The station broadcasts at 89.1 FM in Montgomery. Their call letters are WLBF, which stands for "We Live By Faith." Mr. Wiely Bowsell from Trinity Church is the Chief Engineer. He keeps all the electronic components functioning so the radio programs can be broadcast. Mr. John Albritton, Jr. is on the Board of Directors, which oversees all of the station activities.
