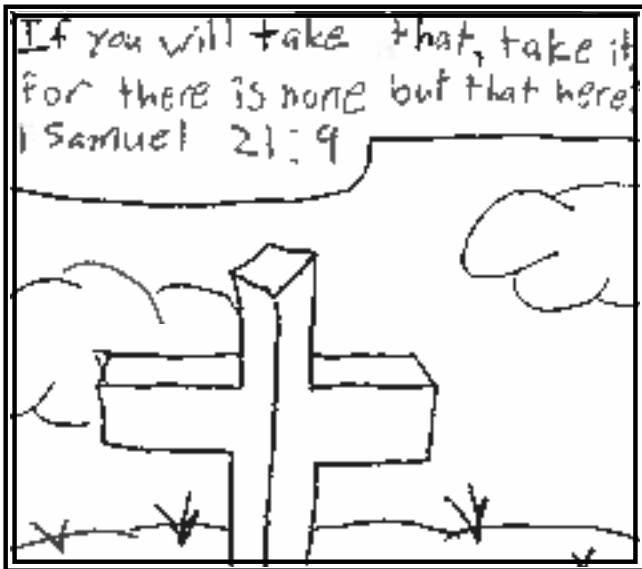

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

When I was in college and seminary, I spent five summers on Lookout Mountain as a camp counselor/minister. Those were some of my most fun-filled summer days!! And one of the beauties of North Alabama (as well as Georgia and Tennessee) are the caves, caverns, water falls, springs, cool weather, and even white-water rafting very near.

While caverns and caves were not my most favorite thing – I am rather tall, and I really don't like cramped spaces – I still enjoyed the cool air, the wet walls, and the experience.

David is on the run. King Saul is tracking him down like a wild animal. Saul is out of his mind, and he wants to kill David. So, often David and his men would find safety in mountains, hillsides, caverns, and caves. The cave in which we find him this morning is described as having springs, food, and even places where sheep could graze.

But David is nonetheless in the fight of his life.

When Saul comes into the cave, David has an opportunity to kill him, but he doesn't. He honors "the king." He knows that his place is to wait on God; to leave it in His hands.

Often, we want to take things into our own hands. We worry, and then we think we have to work everything out. But it is best to wait on God...always. And if it IS someone who is bothering you, God will take care of that person – we leave it in His hands.

(That does not mean we don't seek help or tell someone if someone is hurting us.)

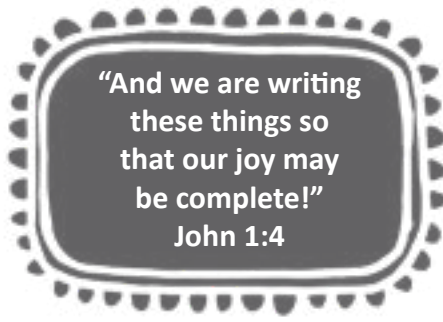
Lastly, we will also talk about friendship this morning. But what I really want you to think about is: Is Jesus your Friend? Is He your best Friend? Do you know Him as the One Who is always with you? He is!! And He does love you. And there is no friend like Jesus!

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!!
10 EASY STEPS

- #1** Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.

- #6** Take prayer requests.

- #8** Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- #9** Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- #10** Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26



David and Erin were raised in Georgia. He came to faith in Jesus as a child. He went to Auburn and studied chemical engineering, but became a missionary after several missions trips in Europe. Erin came to faith in Jesus during junior high school. She went to Duke University and earned degrees in Middle Eastern Studies and teaching English. She worked for Arab World Ministries in Europe and the Middle East where she learned to speak Arabic and also met David.

After getting married, they served in Bulgaria, and then Ukraine, but moved to Athens, Greece last year. They help start churches or help churches grow by teaching English classes to people from other countries who want to learn our language. In the classes, they teach their students about Jesus and some of those students put their faith in Jesus and join the church. They have two children, Clara and Josiah, who are in the United States to attend college.
