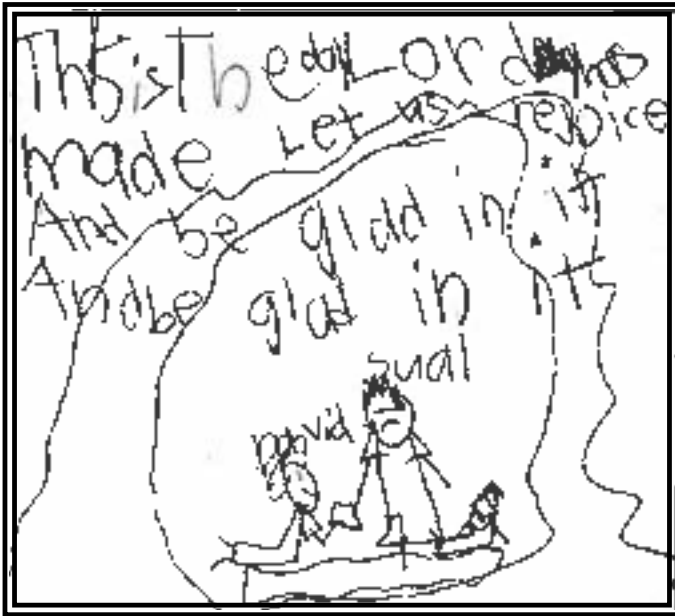

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

I sure have enjoyed reading some of your letters to me about what you are doing this summer. It sounds like you all are having a fun-filled summer!! Praise God; He is so good!

Guess what King David does this morning! He loses his temper. I mean, he REALLY loses it. He gets so mad, that he's angry enough to kill. He wants to kill this man, Nabal, because Nabal refused to give David and his men food and supplies after David had done a lot for Nabal.

A woman steps in and keeps David from following through. It's Nabal's wife, Abigail. And when she stops David, she saves Nabal's life, her own life, and all of his household.

We will learn a lot about Abigail this morning. She was wise and beautiful; but she was even more than that. She was also hospitable. She was "quick on her feet." She could make a decision very fast and follow through. She was willing to go to David and speak to him of his sin, but she was VERY, VERY humble about it.

There is a lot to learn from Abigail. Perhaps this morning as you listen to the sermon, you will want to try to be more like Abigail in your home: humble, forgiving, generous, wise, nice, kind, loving to everyone in your family, and loving God.

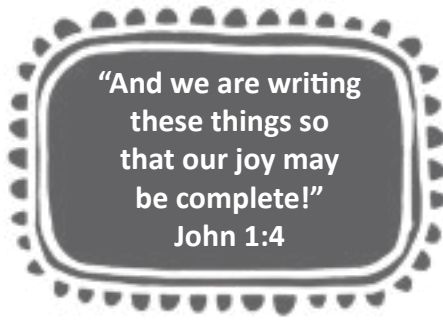
And David does repent; he does not follow through with his plan to kill Nabal. But God takes care of Nabal. He dies in the end, and David and Abigail are married. It's a wonderful story of redemption.

Suggested Questions for Mom and Dad to Use This Week

3. Nabal was a nasty man; very mean. What else can you remember about Nabal? In what ways can you pray to God to help you not be like Nabal? And Who should we try to be like? (Jesus; and you might describe to your children what Christ-like means.)
4. What is it about God and His love as well as Jesus and His love that would make you want to be more like Him? What has He done for you?

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!!
10 EASY STEPS

- #1** Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.

- #10** Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26



Meet Our Missionaries!



The Petrou Family Argyris, Dina, Mark, Erik, & Erastos Serving in Athens, Greece with Advancing Ministries of the Gospel

Dr. Petrou and his family are missionaries in their own country. They have visited Trinity Church several times, and some of our members have visited them. He teaches in the Greek Bible College where he trains people to be pastors and teachers. Dr. Petrou has helped to start several Presbyterian churches and he often preaches in one of the churches in their city. He has been instrumental in starting a church planting movement to serve Greek people, immigrants, and refugees who come to Athens. Dina leads a ministry for women who have had a very hard life. Their sons, Mark and Erik, graduated from the college where their father teaches. Now they are serving in ministry, too. Erastos is a college student. He was born with a serious heart weakness, but he had surgery 4 years ago and is fully recovered.

Music and Hymns

#498 "Jesus! What a Friend for Sinners!"

Jesus is the perfect friend! He is always there to listen when you need someone to talk to, He loves you no matter what, He doesn't judge you or think less of you, and He is always willing to help! Verse 1 says "...friends may fail me, foes assail me, He, my Savior, makes me whole." Sometimes earthly friends can really hurt us. Unfortunately, friends come and go, but Jesus will never leave us and will never hurt us. Don't rely on your friends to make you happy, rely on Jesus and make Him your best friend! "Hallelujah! what a Savior! Hallelujah! what a friend!....He is with me to the end."

#296 "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name"

Philippians 2:9 says that Jesus' name is above every other name. There are places in the Bible where people were healed simply by having faith in Jesus. We pray in His name because there is power in His name. We are baptized in His name. Demons have been cast out in His name. In the Christmas story, the book of Matthew quotes the prophet Isaiah insaying "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son and they shall call His name Immanuel." Immanuel means "God with us." Jesus, which is Yeshua in its original Hebrew form, means "He will save or the Lord saves." Jesus was a fairly common name when Jesus was born, but He was and is the only one who is "God with us" and it is only by His name that we are saved!
