

Dear Children,

Think about these things:

1. Our God is a great God; 2. Our God is a big God; 3. Our God is a powerful God; 4. Our God is a loving God.

King Saul did not know these things about God. Well, he might have known them about God, but he didn't really believe them in his heart. And do you know: Saul died a terrible death.

Think about it: YOU know and believe more about God than King Saul did. YOU are more like David in so many ways. You are precious. You are loved. You love God, and love worshipping Him. You love learning more about Him. God your Father takes you through things in this life to teach you even more about Him. And He uses His Word to teach you too. He is a great, loving, merciful God.


Suggested Questions for Mom and Dad to Use This Week

1. Mom and dad, this passage affords you an opportunity to talk to your children about death. You should have these conversations at age-appropriate levels. We usually tell children at gravesides that they need not fear death as a Christian, because they will never really die; they just go to heaven. And we tell them from the Children's Catechism that Heaven is a glorious and happy place where the righteous live forever with the Lord. Also, I Corinthians 2:9 is so good for children.

2. You can go pretty deep discussing the differences between Saul and David.

3. Talk about Jonathan. See bulletin for an attempt at Jonathan's Obituary.

4. Discuss: II Corinthians 4:16-18. And explain Who Jesus is and what He did to make that possible.

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS

- #1 Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.

- #10 Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26





Marcus, Heather, Calder and Samantha Rudd

Marcus and Heather Rudd work with Trinity members NoNo and Kate Beale as part of the Isaiah 55 team in Reynosa, Mexico. Heather and Marcus both came to know the Lord when they were children. Their desire is to share the gospel of Jesus with others because it changed their own lives. They met and married in San Antonio, Texas, and it was there that they began taking short-term trips to the U.S./Mexico border.

As a deacon in their church, Marcus was asked to plan the church's first mission trip to the Mexican border. During his first trip to Isaiah 55, Marcus felt God's call to serve with that ministry. After a second trip to Mexico, they immediately sensed God had a place for them there and began to make plans to move to the Mexican border and join the Isaiah 55 staff. Now, they've been there over two years.

Marcus teaches carpentry and other job skills to deaf students from the Isaiah 55 school and teenagers who live in the neighborhood. Calder will be in second grade. Samantha is four years old so she is at home with Heather, but Heather also helps with visiting missions trip teams.
