

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

Have you ever played the “quiet game?”

When I was growing up, my school teachers would tell us we were going to play the “quiet game,” which obviously meant everyone had to be quiet. I don’t really know who ever won or lost the “quiet game.”

Did you know that God likes it when we are quiet before Him? He sure does.

Sometimes it is hard to sit still and quiet. You may be reading this in church, and in church everyone is expected to be still and quiet. But try to sit without moving one little bit for just one minute. Try to sit as still as you possibly can. You will see that it is not easy.

God knows it is not easy. He knows we are distracted by TV and radio and phones and people talking and loud noises. We get distracted by good things like our pets when we are trying to eat our food or when we are trying to do our homework.

But there comes a time during each day when we all should learn to set quiet before the Lord. A time to simply listen to Him. (You could talk to your mom and dad about this if this seems hard to understand. Ask them to teach you how to have a “quiet time” with the Lord.)

But being quiet before the Lord is more than one moment during a day. God likes when we are quiet in the midst of doing the normal parts of our day: driving to school, doing our homework, brushing our teeth, taking out the garbage, and having dinner with the family. Being quiet before the Lord during those times means trusting Him, loving Him, enjoying Him, finding your peace in Him, and being confident that He loves you, and He is taking care of you.


During this month of sermons, are you learning how to return, rest, be quiet and trust God? Again, ask your mom and dad to be talking about these things at home.

- #10** Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26



Sanctity of Human Life Sunday

This week we will be talking about the sanctity of human life. Sanctity means sacred or holy. We normally describe God as holy and we worship Him because of that. People are not holy like God, but the Bible teaches us to treat every person as very special and worthy of respect because God created every human being in His image.

Each person is different and unique because of their eyes, skin color, foot size, finger prints, personality, age, and in many other ways, but everyone has the life that God created in them. No animal is described that way in the Bible. Psalm 139 says we are fearfully and wonderfully made by God and that He knows everything about each of us.

Because God gives each person life, He wants us to treat everyone with the same respect no matter how young or old they are or what color their skin is. The Bible tells us to take extra special care of those who cannot take care of themselves like babies, orphans, the poor, and elderly people. We should do that every day, but we reserve this special day in January to remind us to always do that.
