






Suggested Questions for Mom and Dad to Use This Week

- 1. Parents, what a wonderful week to explain “All Saints Day,” and for your family to remember loved ones or friends who have died. Talk to your children about death and the hope of heaven. Use the Children’s Catechism to help you. What a perfect week to give testimony to grandparents or maybe on your children’s heroes, and then to pray thanksgiving for their life.**
- 2. Spend time one night talking about all the good things about each person in the family and giving thanks for them and each quality.**
- 3. How did David respond to Rizpah in II Samuel 21:10-14? How do you respond to this mother’s compassion?**
- 4. One time in “family time” this week you might read through the liturgy of thanks for life at the close of the morning service. (found in the bulletin)**
- 5. Who can you pray for this week as a family – for someone with a loss in their family? You may know them; you may not. They may be famous, or they may be local. Who can you pray for?**

**THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!!
10 EASY STEPS**

- #1** Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
- #2** Try really hard to make the same time every day.

- #4** Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
- #5** Sing a song or two together.
- #6** Take prayer requests.

- #8** Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- #9** Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- #10** Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26



Alabama Fellowship of Christian Athletes

Since 1954, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) has challenged coaches and athletes to impact the world for Jesus Christ. Today, a staggering 57.3 million youth under the age of 18 play organized sports programs which is why FCA is needed more than ever. The playing field is where many cultivate their values. The FCA mission is to present to coaches and athletes, and all whom they influence, the challenge and adventure of receiving Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, and serving Him in their relationships and in the fellowship of the Church. They seek to make disciples through methods of Engaging, Equipping and Empowering coaches and athletes to know and grow in Christ and lead others to do the same.

Trinity Church has been instrumental in starting and sustaining FCA in Montgomery and across Alabama for many years.

Will you pray for FCA?:

- Please pray for FCA to expand church partnerships like Trinity is currently doing with the Carver team into women's sports in all Montgomery schools. They need women to be involved and churches to adopt these women's teams in our public schools.

This hymn reminds us that, as believers, we are also soldiers in Christ who fight against evil. The Lord is our captain, our light, our rock, and our fortress. We have to keep fighting for what is right and against evil until the day that Jesus returns and evil is defeated once and for all! Today we remember those in our church who have passed since the last All Saints Day.

We Come Before You, God Most High

This hymn, sung to the tune of hullandfelder, was written by Bishop Timothy Dudley-Smith for the 125th anniversary celebration of Trinity Presbyterian Church in 2016. There are several themes found in the hymn that celebrate TPC, such as: a reference to earlier members of the church, and its 'founding fathers', the unity across the years in a common faith in Christ, His saving grace, and His glorious Name, and a reference to Isaiah 40:8: 'The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand for ever'. This is used each week in the church as the people's response to the reading of the Scripture.
