



Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

Do you know what the last words of Jesus were?

Father, into Your hands I commit My Spirit. And then we are told that Jesus breathed His last. He was giving up Himself to the Father after having suffered so much for you and me. And quite honestly, that is a wonderful prayer we can pray daily – not as a prayer at the end of our lives (though that would be a wonderful "final prayer"), but committing to Him everything everyday: Father, into Your hands I commit myself, my belongings, my mom and dad, my family, my pet, my school, my grades, my music, my reading, my TV watching ... nothing do I withhold.

Well, this morning, we will hear the final words that David spoke before he died. There will be more words he will speak with his son, Solomon, before he dies, but these are his last words that everyone heard. And they are beautiful words, and I hope you will try really hard to listen and think about what you can learn from his words and my sermon.

When my children were your age, they always had a secret word they said to us before they went to bed or got out of the car to walk into school. It is still our family secret word. But the reason we say it is because if anything were to happen to us, we would want that word to be the last word we said to each other.

Maybe you should think of something you would say to your mom and dad or brother or sister every single time you say good-bye, even if those words are: I love you.


I sure do love each one of you.

Suggested Questions for Mom and Dad to Use This Week

- 1. Mom and Dad, you might consider some age appropriate stories about "final words before dying." While we are studying David's final words this morning, I will mention a few other "notable" words spoken by a few people. Maybe you could share with your children final words of your parents or grandparents.
- 2. Explain to your children why they are as important to God as the "big names" in the Bible. Emphasize how much God cares about them.
- 3. How can we be God's mouthpiece in others' lives?
- 4. Give examples of "good authority" and examples of "bad, abusive authority."
- 5. How does David point us to the True King, Jesus, this morning in II Sam. 23:1-7? How does Jesus exercise His authority ~ harshly or kindly?

Parents, why don't you look above and answer those questions for yourself and with your children? What HAVE you learned in this series in David's life? How can you help your children apply David's life (and David's Savior) to them and their lives?

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS

Just make sure you gather once a day as a family. #1 #2 Try really hard to make the same time every day. #3 It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect. Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional. #4 #5 Sing a song or two together. #6 Take prayer requests. #7 Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for. #8 Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/ #9 or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/ hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day. #10 Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26 The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you: the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.



First Choice Women's Medical Center began as Sav-A-Life Montgomery in 1982 and opened a Crisis Pregnancy Center. In 1997, it purchased the building on Mendel Parkway off the Atlanta Highway. In 2007, it began transition to a medical center with ultrasound equipment that has been one of the biggest elements in helping abortion minded women comprehend the life of the child that exists within their womb.
