

 The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and




give you peace.

MEET OUR MISSIONARIES

Friendship Mission provides shelter to approximately 100 men, women, and children in two locations and serves approximately 8,000 meals each month. The men's shelter is on Mobile Highway in West Montgomery. The shelter for women and women with children is located in Chisholm on the North side of Montgomery. The goal of this ministry is to provide residents with the tools they need to repair past mistakes and facilitate independent living. Residents are involved in a variety of activities, including basic life skills classes, Bible studies, substance abuse counseling, GED classes, employment, and college courses. These programs are designed to assist residents in transitioning to independent living and are done in partnership with multiple agencies in the River Region to make this program a success. The ministry was started in 1998 by Pastor Vince Rosato and his wife Mary. Tammy Middleton served as Executive Director following Pastor Rosato's retirement. Tara Davis was named Executive Director in October 2018 to replace Tammy Middleton. Trinity Church has supported Friendship Mission since it was formed.

Please pray that all hungry and homeless people everywhere find good food, safe shelter, stability and compassion.
