Dear Children,

Have you enjoyed the lights of Christmas this season? I know I have!

It's almost time to start putting up the lights. My family always takes out the lights the day after Thanksgiving, and then we try to get all the lights back in the box before January 1. So, I suppose we'll be trying to get all the lights back in the boxes this week.

One thing I will suggest at the end of my sermon today is that as you put the lights back in the box, say a prayer: "Lord, Jesus, help me to be Your light this year."

How can you be a light for Jesus?

As the family gathers, begin with the Lord's Prayer.

Suggested Hymns: #211 "God Rest You Merry, Gentlemen"

#195 "Joy to the World! The Lord Is Come"

Suggested Family Worship Topics:

Monday: Following the Lord's Prayer, let the father open with prayer.

Read: Psalm 103:13

<u>Discuss</u>: In Mr. Mac's sermon we learned about a missionary by the name of Robert J. Thomas. Can anyone recount the story of his sacrifice to get Bibles to Korea? Did he help bring light to people living in darkness? How can we bring light into a dark situation?

Tuesday: Following the Lord's Prayer, let the mother open with prayer.

<u>Discuss</u>: In what ways do we see in the following passages a witness for Christ?

John 8:18; 8:14; 10:25; 5:39; 4:29; 9:25; 15:26

Wednesday: Following the Lord's Prayer, let a child open with prayer.

Read: John 1:6-13

<u>Discuss</u>: How did John the Baptist let his light shine for Christ? Who did John talk about in his witnessing: himself or Jesus? Was his witness backed up with

this life? In what ways?

Thursday: Following the Lord's Prayer, let a child open with prayer.

Read: Psalm 23

<u>Discuss</u>: What is the goal in witnessing for Christ? What do we want to see

happening in that person's life?

<u>Friday</u>: Following the Lord's Prayer, let the father open with prayer.

Read: John 1:12

<u>Discuss</u>: What are some of the privileges of an adopted child of God? Is prayer a benefit of being a child of God? In what way? How is it that we are given access to God the Father? One more time this week: How can we be witnesses for Christ? How can we let our light shine for Him?

<u>Saturday</u>: Before bed, everyone in the family gathers for prayer. Mom or Dad can read Mr. Mac's letter to the children. After discussing the next morning (getting up, getting dressed, being ready for worship and Sunday School), let every one in the family lie prostrate... on their face, and pray for the Sabbath. Pray for worship, for Mr. Mac, for the one leading the service, for the choir and Mr. Reed and Mr. Alexander, for the preaching and singing and prayers.





Mario Xoca Isaiah 55 Reynosa, Mexico

Mario and Keila met in high school, and were married after graduating from university. He was hired by LG Electronics as a computer science engineer, and then began working as an IT manager in 2007 for TRW Automotive, where he was in charge of the four factory plants located in Reynosa.

In 2012 they felt a strong calling to share the Gospel with more people, so they planted Camino de Fe (Way of Faith) Church. Mario was a bi-vocational pastor while continuing to work with TRW.
