

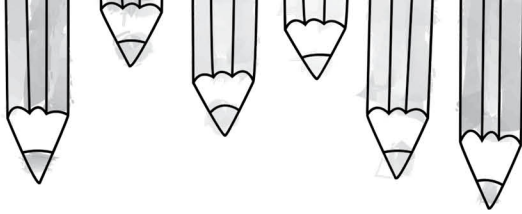

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

This morning we will have the privilege to hear from Coach Oliver and Mrs. Pam McLemore. Some of you know Coach McLemore from Trinity School, and I am certain you all know their children: Thomas, Charlie, Rebecca, Joseph, and Sadie.

The McLemores were missionaries in Budapest, Hungary. They taught in a very nice school, and God used them very much.

Oliver's sister, Whittington McLemore Black, also went there for two years to help in this amazing ministry; as well as to help Oliver and Pam with the children. You know Mrs. Whittington and her husband, Mr. Wesley Black, and their children: William and Daniel.

The McLemores grew up at Trinity Church, just like you. They went to Sunday School and learned their memory work, just like you. They went to school in Montgomery, just like you. They went to college, and they felt God was calling them to serve somewhere overseas – outside of America. And so they obeyed God's call, and they went to serve Him in Hungary.

10 EASY STEPS

- #1** Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.

- #6** Take prayer requests.

- #8** Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- #9** Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- #10** Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26

#672 "Trust and Obey"

"Trust and obey, for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey." Do you trust and obey your parents?

What happens when you don't obey? You normally get into some type of trouble, right? Well, Jesus also has rules for you to follow and he gives them not to hurt you, but for your own good, just like your parents. For example, Jesus tells us in the Bible not to lie. Lying can hurt others, but it can also hurt you. When you lie you have to hide all of the time and try to think up other lies to cover your original lie. Lies can make you feel really terrible. Jesus is trying to protect you. He knows what is good for you and all of His Commandments are for your good.

Trust and obey your parents and trust and obey Jesus.

#247 "O Sacred Head Now Wounded"

This hymn praises and thanks Jesus Christ for dying on the cross for our sins. The author of this hymn declares: "'Tis I deserve

Thy place." Jesus stood in our place. He took the punishment for our sins and He paid the full price for our freedom. Let this be your prayer: "Lord, let me never, never outlive my love to Thee." How can we ever thank Him for such a sacrifice? The hymn writer asks, "what language shall I borrow to thank Thee, dearest Friend?" Can you think of some ways you can thank Jesus for dying for you?
