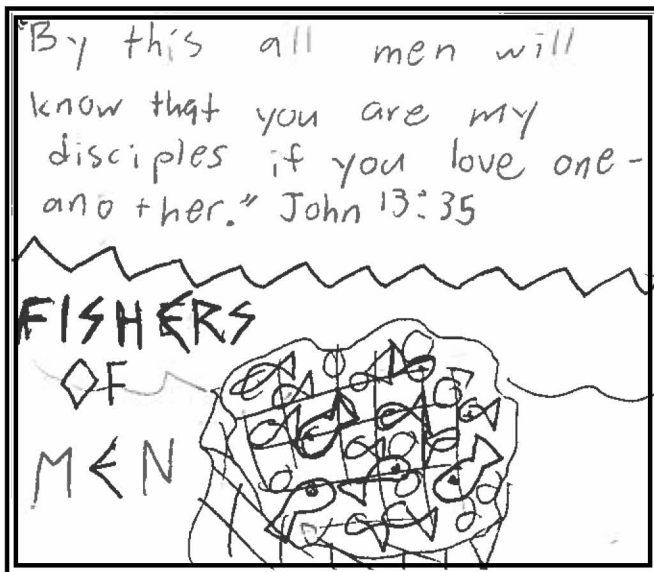


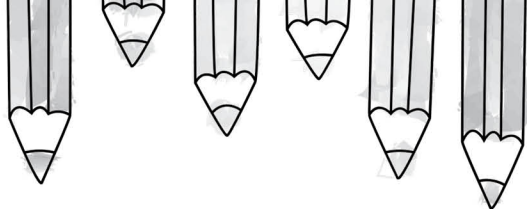

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

Do ever read the Psalms? Do you like the Psalms?

Reading Psalms is like reading someone else's prayer; or perhaps a song they wrote. The Psalm tells you a great deal about the person, but it also teaches us a lot about God.

The Psalms have so much to teach us!!

Do you remember that last year we studied the life of King David? Well, this year we plan to study many of the Psalms he wrote. He wrote so many of his Psalms in the midst of many of the stories we studied last year.

The Psalm we are studying this morning – Psalm 8 – could have been written with the giant Goliath in mind. We think that because of the title to the Psalm; David tells us this has something to do with Gath – the home town of Goliath.

I love the Psalms. I need the Psalms. I hope you will start reading the Psalms. Lots of people read a Psalm every day. Ask your mom and dad to read some Psalms with you – some quick suggestions would be Psalm 1, then Psalm 8 since we are studying it today, then maybe Psalm 23.

Psalms help you when you are sad, happy, frustrated, tired, bullied, in need of confessing your sin ... there are lots and lots of ways the Psalms help us.

May you enjoy reading more and more Psalms.

Suggested Questions for Mom and Dad to Use this Week:

1. Mom and Dad, start reading the Psalms with your children! A good place to start might be with reading the Psalms we will be studying this year. Read a Psalm a week together as a family. This week would be Psalm 8.
2. What do you think about God when we talk about His majesty and glory? What about His being the Creator?
3. Do you know that God loves you? Do you know He is always with you?
4. Kind of deep: do you love yourself? Do you love yourself as one of God's children? If you know that God loves you, shouldn't you love yourself too? Talk to your children about a healthy love for oneself.
5. Go outside and look at all the stars. Or go outside and just talk about stars, trees, grass, mountains, space, the sun, the moon, galaxies, rain, thunder, clouds, lightning; and ask yourself: how is that such a great God loves someone even like me?

10 EASY STEPS

- #1** Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.



Meet Our Missionaries!



Greg and Julieann Global Serve International

Greg grew up in Michigan and had a lot of exposure to missionary work from a young age. After high school, Greg spent 1 year working in South America. After returning, he graduated from Michigan State University and moved to Columbia, South Carolina to begin working for one of the largest chemical corporations in the US, as a chemist and engineer. At the same time, he began attending seminary for his Postgraduate work in Missiology and Theology. It was there, that he met his wife, Julieann, who was from New Jersey and had also felt the Lord's call to missions at a young age.

Greg and Julieann were married in 1990, and in 1994 they moved to North Asia to begin work among a completely unreached people group. They lived among these people for years, learning the language and the culture, and raised their 2 boys there. They started a local business to be able to stay in the area, and eventually were able to train up several pastors to take over the local church. In 2007, they moved to Central Asia to begin work there. Following this model, Greg worked with several others to found Global Serve International, so other workers could gain access to unreached people groups. He serves today as the International Director, and splits his time between equipping our church planters in overseas fields, and speaking at churches all over the US.

Trinity Church began supporting Greg & Julieann in 1999. In 2017, we committed support for the first five years of the Rujak Bible Translation Project which is being done by one of their multidisciplinary Global Serve teams.
