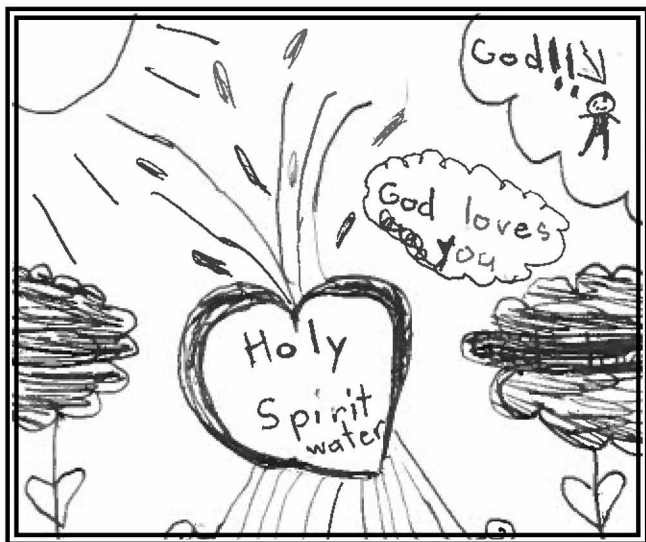


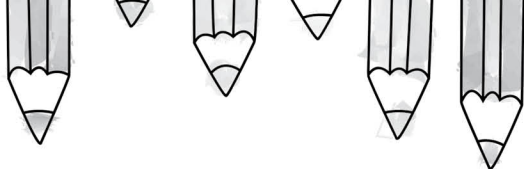

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

Think of Jesus in three ways:

1. He is your Savior.
2. He is your Shepherd.
3. He is your Sovereign. (BIG WORD for Supreme Ruler; King; Lord)

He Is Your Savior ~ Psalm 22

Have you ever thought about how cruel Jesus' death on the cross was for you? It was brutal. He was beaten. He was bruised. He was bleeding. They nailed nails into His hands and feet. They made fun of Him. They gambled for His clothing. It was a horrible scene to pay for your sins and mine. The worst of it all was taking God's wrath on Himself for us. But He did because He loved us.

He Is Your Shepherd ~ Psalm 23

He takes care of you. He watches over you. He protects you. He loves you. If you wonder off like a lost sheep, He goes after to find you and bring you back. He is always there for you.

He Is Your Sovereign ~ Psalm 24

Jesus is King Jesus. When you pray to Him, you can call Him "King Jesus." We praise Him as the highest monarch there is! He is worthy of our praise.

Erik Liddell was a man born in Scotland. God made him fast; very fast. He won a gold medal in the 1924 Olympics. He refused to run one of the races because it was on a Sunday, THE LORD'S DAY! Oh, that we would have that kind of courage today! After that he was a missionary to China. He ended up as a prisoner of war where he died. He was a great man. His last words before he died were: Must surrender all. He was talking about how the *Christian must surrender all* they have to Jesus.

Can you see that from these Psalms and my sermon this morning: our Savior, Shepherd and Sovereign is worthy of our surrendering all to Him ... all to Him I owe.

Suggested Questions for Mom and Dad to Use this Week:

1. Mom and Dad, I have been saying this to you in this Children's' Bulletin for four weeks: start reading the Psalms with your children! A good place to start might be with reading the Psalms we will be studying this year. Read a Psalm a week together as a family. This week there is a wonderful group of three: Psalms 22, 23 and 24. See my letter to the children above for any guidance in reading these Psalms together this week.
2. Tell the children why you are thankful Jesus is your Savior; then why you are thankful He is your Shepherd; and finally, why you are thankful He is your Sovereign. Ask them for feedback.
3. Memorize Psalm 24:7 together. Or at least, read it out loud together each evening (or morning) this week.
4. Read through Mr. Mac's outline to his sermon with some suggested Scriptures to read in addition. This should help you with any extra material you might need to have time in the Word and prayer with your family this week.
5. Pray together. One night offer only praise and thanksgiving. The next night confess sins. The next night ask God for things. Pray for missionaries. Pray for Trinity Church.

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!!
10 EASY STEPS

- #1** Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
- #2** Try really hard to make the same time every day.
- #3** It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
- #4** Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
- #5** Sing a song or two together.
- #6** Take prayer requests.
- #7** Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
- #8** Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- #9** Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- #10** Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26
The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.

Here we find a reminder that we are to hold the cross of Christ ever before our eyes as we await that time when all the world will "adore His sacred name." One day, when Jesus returns to rule the world as King, there will be no more suffering, sadness, pain, evil, or even darkness. It is going to be better than anything you could ever dream of or imagine! The only reason we will be able to be with Jesus in this wonderful place is because He died on the cross for us, because He loves us!

#235 "All Glory, Laud, and Honor"

We sing this every Palm Sunday because it mentions the children crying out "hosanna" as they waved their palms at His passing through the gates of Jerusalem on a donkey. Hosanna can be translated as "please save" or "save now." Did you know the word "laud" means "praise?" Zechariah prophesied about Jesus riding on a donkey in Zechariah 9:9 which states: "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is He, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey."
