

I love to walk. Usually, I walk alone, but sometimes Miss Betsy will go with me, and other times I will take our dog. Her name is Georgia. When she hears me getting her leash out, she starts "going crazy" jumping all around because she is so excited about going for a walk.

In the Christian life, we talk about "walking with the Lord," or "walking with Jesus." Some Christians ask other Christians, "How is your walk with the Lord going?" It is a wonderful picture because it is true that we walk with Jesus, and He walks with us. In fact, there is never a time when HE is not walking with us.

He has given us wonderful ways to walk with Him: prayer, His Word, fellowship with other believers, worship, Sunday School, family time in prayer, by trusting and obeying ... and lots of ways. You could even say that God the Father WANTS to walk with you; He LONGS to walk with you.

I would say that you should be as excited as my dog Georgia to get to walk with Jesus, but that's how excited Jesus is to walk with YOU. I say that with reverence for Him, but He really, really wants you to walk with Him every minute of every day.



Meet Our Missionaries!



Victor & Nosizo Nakah Mission to the World Sub-Saharan Africa

Victor and Nosizo met in college and are products of the Christian student ministry movement. They were richly impacted by the ministries of Scripture Union in high school and International Fellowship of Evangelical Students in college. Victor later served with both organizations for several years and was instrumental in establishing Christian student groups in universities in southern Zimbabwe.

Victor is an ordained Presbyterian minister, and has served in various capacities in the church and related organizations. His most recent position was with CURE International, where he served as senior vice president for spiritual ministry. Before joining CURE, he served as the Africa regional director for Overseas Council International. He was also a seminary president for 10 years in Zimbabwe. During this time, he earned a master's degree in systematic theology from the University of South Africa and a Ph.D. in systematic theology from Stellenbosch University. Nosizo received a master's degree in information science at that time as well.

In addition to his primary ministry as MTW international director for Sub-Saharan Africa, Victor supervises master's and Ph.D. students attending South Africa Theological Seminary, teaches at the Africa Reformation Theological Seminary (Uganda), and is Extraordinary Researcher for North-West University. The Nakahs have two adult daughters.

"Trust and obey, for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey." Do you trust and obey your parents? What happens when you don't obey?
