- 1. Mom and Dad, accept my challenge in the letter to the children to read Psalm 103 each day this week. If you can do it as a family, all the better; but if not, encourage your children to do it, and you set a good example. It will be well worth it.
- 2. What are the reasons David praises God in 103:1-5?


