Dear Children,

I want you to learn to do something.

Imagine that someone tells you that you sing really well. Or perhaps they say to you that you have very nice parents. Or they say to you that they are impressed with the way you study so hard. Or they compliment your clothes or your hair or your smile. Maybe they tell you that you did a really good job.

I want you to think about something each time someone says something nice about you. I want you to do two things:

- 1. I want your first thought to be: God did this for me.
- 2. And then I want you to learn to say in a very humble way: Thank the Lord. Or, you could say, That is very nice; thank you; I am really thankful the Lord gave me my parents, OR I am thankful God has given me a desire to study, OR I am thankful God helped me do my best.

Talk to your mom and dad about this because perhaps they can explain it better than I can. They will know what I am talking about: giving God the credit!
Telling others that God receives all the glory in my life; I thank Him; and, I give it all to Him.

You don't ALWAYS have to say it. Sometimes you can simply thank the person but know in your heart who really gets the praise. But I am hoping you will think about some way to let that person know that you are thankful to God.

It will not make you prideful; it will show humility. Jesus was always giving God the Father the glory. The Holy Spirit is always pointing us to Jesus.

And do you know that humility leads to prayer; and prayer leads to worship; and worship leads to God blessing you.

I sure do love you, and I am so proud of you that YOU are a member of Trinity Church. And ... I give God the glory for that!!

Suggested Questions for Mom and Dad to Use this Week:

- 1. Mom and dad, as always in this series, read Psalm 144 multiple times this week with your children; and/or read it in its various sections throughout the week.
- 2. If you read Mr. Mac's letter to the children, you can help them think of ways they can give God the glory and credit for all good things in their lives.
- 3. Read as a family: I Corinthians 4:7; II Samuel 7:18; Proverbs 30:7-9; and Malachi 3:10. And talk to your children about money!! Children who learn to tithe rarely go back on the practice as adults.
- 4. What do we learn from Psalm 144:12-14 about how to pray for our family and our nation?
- 5. Why is Jesus the greatest blessing of all?

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS

- #1 Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
- #2 Try really hard to make the same time every day.
- #3 It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
- #4 Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
- #5 Sing a song or two together.
- #6 Take prayer requests.
- #7 Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
- #8 Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- #9 Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day
- #10 Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26

The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.
