

#### A Guide to Family Worship October 19 - October 24

Suggested Questions for Mom and Dad to Use this Week:

- 1. Mom and dad, as always in this series, read Psalm 145 multiple times this week with your children; and/or read it in its various sections throughout the week. This is our second week in this Psalm; our final Psalm of David in our series. So, if you were in Psalm 145 all of last week, perhaps you would want to read Psalms 146-150 as a family this week; one Psalm per day.
- 2. Talk this week to your children about missions. What do missionaries do? Can you name one or more of our missionaries? (see www.trinitypca.org) Pray for that missionary.
- 3. Talk to your children about different ways to show Jesus to others. We talk about our favorite foods, movies, college football teams ... do we talk about our Best Friend Who actually gave us those things to enjoy? Why or why not?
- 4. Ask your children what the difference is between these two statements: (a) I obey, therefore I am accepted by God; and, (b) God loves me, and because I am already accepted by Him in Christ, I obey. (The latter is the gospel; the former is only religion. And it's never too young to start teaching your children the difference.)
- 5. There is a hymn, Jesus, What a Friend for Sinners. Talk about what it means for Jesus to be Your Friend; how He is One born for adversity; Who sticks closer than a brother.

#### THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS

- #1 Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
- **Try really hard to make the same time every day.**
- #3 It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
- #4 Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
- #5 Sing a song or two together.
- #6 Take prayer requests.
- #7 Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks
- #8 Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- #9 Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day
- #10 Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24-26

The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.



#### Meet Our Missionaries!



Dr. Argyris & Dina Petrou

Greek Bible College/House of Damaris

Athens, Greece

Argyris serves in a full-time teaching position at the Greek Bible College, following 10 years of pastoral experience in Toronto and Piraeus, 8 years in the evangelistic and publishing work in Greece, and 12 years in the leadership of the Greek Evangelical Alliance. In addition to serving as a professor at the Greek Bible College, the only Bible school in Greece, he is also a preacher and ordained minister of the Greek Evangelical Church, and a published author through the Greek publishing house, O LOGOS. Following years of being a pastor's wife and a mom, Dina began ministering to women in downtown Athens. Recently, she founded and now serves as the director of Damaris House, a ministry providing safe housing and a recovery program to survivors of trafficking and exploitation. This ministry empowers women to find freedom, walk through their journey of healing, and reintegrate into society. Trinity's partnership with a half dozen or more Greek pastors and church planters began through our relationship with Argyris Petrou in 2008. He has been our host for several missions trips to Athens and, has in turn, visited Trinity Church several times.

## Music and Hymns

#### #55 "To God Be the Glory"

This hymn reminds us of what Jesus has done for us. He "yielded His life an atonement for sin, and opened the lifegate that we may go in." Jesus gave His life for us so that we may be forgiven of our sins and live in Heaven with Him for all eternity. Did you know that Jesus doesn't just save good people? He will also save those who have done terrible things if they believe in Him. Verse 2 says "the vilest offender who truly believes, that moment from Jesus forgiveness receives."

#### # 460 "Amazing Grace!"

Amazing Grace is probably the most recognizable hymn to most Christians. The simple words of this old favorite were written in 1779 by John Newton while living in England. Since his early life was filled with sin, this hymn is thought to have been his own testimony of his conversion and life as a Christian. The melody is an Early American tune of unknown origin. This hymn is of great comfort to the sinner saved by grace! If you believe in Jesus and make Him Lord of your life, he will also forgive you of your sins!
