Good morning boys and girls!!

Have you ever heard the quote "Hope springs eternal..."? It's been my experience that this is something that people say to someone that they want to encourage when a situation might seem hope-less. You will not find this expression in the Bible, but what it means is that we always have hope. Indeed, the disciple Peter, in his letter to Christians who were suffering because of their faith, points us to our one TRUE hope: Jesus Christ.

Turn in your Bibles to 1 Peter 1:3-9 and read the passage to yourself. As you probably already know, Jesus' disciple Peter was the writer of 1st and 2nd Peter in the New Testament. In verse 3, what word does Peter use to describe the type of hope that we have in Christ Jesus? If you said "living" you are correct! If something is living, it is not dead, it is active or alive. Because of what Jesus did for us on the cross, we have a new life and can look forward to the day when Jesus returns! Verse 4 goes on to refer to "...an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you..." Do you know what an "inheritance" is? An inheritance is something of value that is passed on to an heir. In worldly terms, it usually means money or valuable items—things that can certainly perish. As Christians though, our inheritance, our salvation thru Jesus Christ, can never fade or pass away or die. Our inheritance is kept and protected for us in Heaven.

Does this imperishable hope mean that we will not go through some difficult times? It does not. We will still experience sadness, disappointment, and grief; but as Christians our faith or belief is not in the things of this world because we know that those things will not last. Rather, verses 5-7 tell us that our inheritance is being guarded in heaven, but that we will go thru trials that will test our faith and make sure that it is real and genuine. Scripture is full of references to hope. I invite you to read Jeremiah 29:11; Isaiah 40:31; Romans 12:12; and Romans 8:24-25. Mr. Curles will refer to these scripture references today in his sermon.

I want to close today with one of my favorite verses: Jeremiah 29:11. "For I know the plans I have for you declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope."

1. Parents: It would be a great exercise this week to share your "faith stories" with your children. What are some things that have happened to you in your life that strengthened your faith in Jesus? Also, at what point in your life did you realize that your hope was in Jesus alone?



Mark Petrou Child Evangelism Fellowship Athens, Greece

Mark Petrou is one of three sons of Trinity missionaries Argyris and Dina Petrou who live in Athens, Greece. Mark's father, Argyris, teaches at the Greek Bible College and trains people to be pastors and teachers. Mark's mother, Dina, has a ministry for women in their city called Community House Damaris.

After completing university studies in Physics, mandatory national military service and earning a degree from the Greek Bible College, Mark Petrou volunteered and then was accepted as a staff member with Child Evangelism Fellowship. He spends four days a week tutoring and evangelizing children in a Gypsy settlement, while also participating in the CEF events in Athens and surrounding Greek locations. The Petrous have been supported by Trinity Church since 2008.
