

A GUIDE TO FAMILY WORSHIP • NOVEMBER 23-28

Monday • *Read:* Philippians 4:1-7

For Discussion: In your own words, what is peace? What is worry? Do you worry? If so, about what? What does this text tell us to do about our worry?

Tuesday • *Read:* 1 Peter 5:7

For Discussion: Repeat 1 Peter 5:7 five times out loud. What can we learn from this verse? Should we memorize it and recount it during the day?

Wednesday • *Read:* Matthew 6:25-34

For Discussion: According to Matthew 6:25-34, why should we not worry? What did Mr. Mac say was the difference between Mary and Martha? Which are you?

Thursday • *Read:* Ephesians 3:20-21

For Discussion: In your own words, what is prayer? Why did Mr. Mac say that prayer is hard work? In Philippians 4:6-7, what does Paul say prayer includes?

Friday • *Read:* Hebrews 13:15-16


For Discussion: Why is there no peace for those who do not know Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior? What does it mean that God's peace surpasses all understanding? Do you have this peace? Why or why not?

Saturday • Before bed, everyone in the family gathers for prayer. Mom or Dad can read Mr. Mac's letter to the children. Marcus and Heather joined the Isaiah 55 staff in October 2016 along with their two kids, Calder and Samantha. Their calling to ministry on the border started with short-term trips they took from their churches in San Antonio and then Georgetown, Texas. It was through one of these short-term trips in 2013 that the Rudds became acquainted with Isaiah 55 Ministries and felt a specific call to join the missionary team there full time. Soon after, they began the transition to full time ministry work on the border.

Currently, Marcus uses his background in art and construction in managing Isaiah 55's trade school for deaf children as well as small scale manufacturing projects to teach work skills to the deaf students as well as hearing members of the local neighborhood community. Heather uses her background as a church administrator and professional organizer in the Isaiah 55 office and is involved with the community outreach program and girls Bible study.
