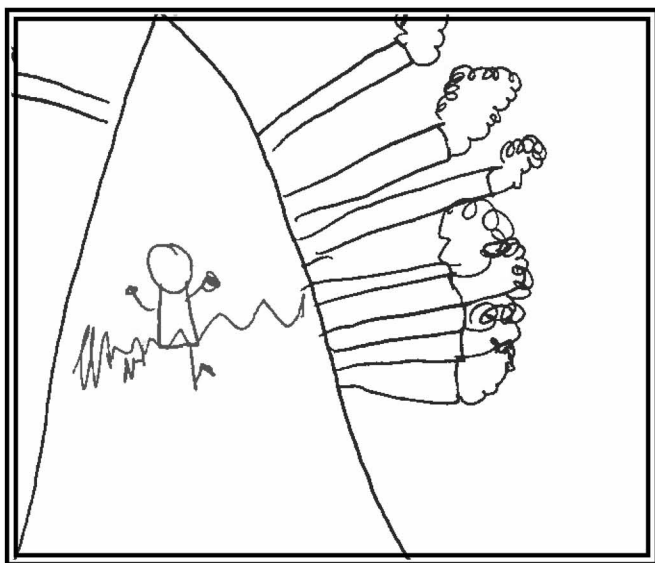


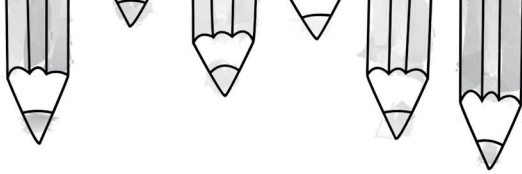

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

Do you have things you fear?

Are there things in this world or in your life that make you afraid?

Now read these verses from Psalm 27.

The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?

The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

The Bible does not teach us that there is nothing to be afraid of; there are plenty of things to fear in this world. If I were walking down a path in the woods, and I came upon a lion, I would be afraid. But it is not always lions. It can be people, or troubling times in our lives, or things that make us sad.

But when you read the prayer of David in Psalm 27 you realize that our God is bigger than any problem we have. He is bigger than anything in this world that scares you.

Mr. Beaver in The Chronicles of Narnia said of Aslan, the Lion who represented Jesus: *Safe? said Mr. Beaver. Don't you hear what Mrs. Beaver tells you? Who said anything about safe? 'Course He isn't safe ... but He is good. He's the King, I tell you.*

Your God is all-powerful; He holds the universe together. But He is good, and He loves you.

Suggested Questions for Mom and Dad to Use this Week:

1. Mom and Dad, start reading the Psalms with your children! A good place to start might be with reading the Psalms we will be studying this year. Read a Psalm a week together as a family. This week would be Psalm 27.
2. Read Mr. Mac's letter to the children. Perhaps read it yourself, then use it for your devotional one day this week.
3. Perhaps you already did this in Number 2 (above), but try to share with your children times in your life when you were scared; or things that create fear in you now. Then tell them about how you know God is greater; tell them about your faith in Him to take care of you. (And mom and dad, perhaps this will be the first time in your own life you have done some soul searching to see God's good hand in the midst of something difficult in your life.)
4. Memorize Psalm 27:1.
5. Use the outline David provides in Psalm 27 to lead your family in prayer: (1) praise, adoration; (2) petition; (3) sit quietly and wait on God. Teach them how to "preach to themselves:" Wait on the Lord. Be strong.
6. Rejoice that as Christians you can know this peace and joy. People who do not have a personal relationship with Jesus do not know this peace and joy. Do you and your children have that personal relationship with Jesus?

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!!
10 EASY STEPS

- #1** Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
- #2** Try really hard to make the same time every day.
- #3** It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
- #4** Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
- #5** Sing a song or two together.
- #6** Take prayer requests.
- #7** Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
- #8** Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- #9** Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- #10** Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26
The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.

The current Trinity Church Good News Club ministry at Forest Avenue School is led by a half dozen people who go faithfully each week on Tuesday afternoons after school from mid-September to late April. Trinity Church has a long time association with CEF that spans multiple generations of people who hosted clubs in their homes, taught and assisted in running clubs, and came to faith in Christ and discipleship by attending weekly meetings. Child Evangelism Fellowship, also known as CEF, is the parent organization. It is a Bible-centered, worldwide organization composed of born-again believers, whose purpose is to evangelize boys and girls with the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and to establish (disciple) them in the local church for Christian living. In the USA and Canada, an estimated 40,000 volunteers serve the ministry alongside 700 full-time workers. CEF has over 2,900 missionaries overseas, approximately 2,200 of whom are nationals who are ministering in nearly every country around the world. CEF was founded in 1937, and has grown into the largest evangelistic outreach to children in the world.

Music and Hymns

#508 "Jesus, Lover of My Soul"

This hymn is about the love and comfort that can be found in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. He is our refuge, meaning that we have a place to hide and be safe in Him. His grace covers us with forgiveness and nothing can separate us from His love!

Verse 3 says "Just and holy is Thy name; I am all unrighteousness; false and full of sin I am, Thou are full of truth and grace." We are so sinful and unworthy of His love, yet He chooses to love us. Praise God!

#247 "O Sacred Head, Now Wounded"

This hymn praises and thanks Jesus Christ for dying on the cross for our sins. The author of this hymn declares: "'Tis I deserve

Thy place." Jesus stood in our place. He took the punishment for our sins and He paid the full price for our freedom. Let this be your prayer: "Lord, let me never, never outlive my love to Thee." How can we ever thank Him for such a sacrifice? The hymn writer asks, "what language shall I borrow to thank Thee, dearest Friend?" Can you think of some ways you can thank Jesus for dying for you?
