Dear Children,

New Year! New Book of the Bible: The Gospel of John!

This year we will study the book of JOHN.

So many people love this book. For many, it was the first book of the Bible that they read. JOHN helps you learn a whole lot about the "disciple Jesus loved;" but most important, JOHN helps us learn so much about JESUS!

John had a brother named James, and they were called "Sons of Thunder." They came from a family that had money. They were very proud men; very self-centered. Very motivated and pushy. But the more they got to know Jesus, the more they loved Jesus; and the more they loved Jesus, the more they loved themselves less. It became more about Jesus than it did James and John.

I cannot name here in this letter all the things that you will find in John but not in the other gospels. To name a few: (a) Jesus changing water to wine; (2) resurrection of Lazarus; (3) Jesus washing the disciples' feet; (4) Jesus commanding His disciples in the Upper Room to love one another; (5) when Thomas cries out, *My Lord and My God!* (6) when Jesus walks with Peter and asks him if he loves Him, then tells Peter to feed His sheep.

And there are what are known as the great I AM statements: I am the Bread of Life; I am the Light of the World; I am the Good Shepherd; I am the Resurrection and the Life; I am the Living Water; I am the Vine; I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

Why don't you and your family read through the book of JOHN this year?!

Ask God to show you this year things about Jesus that you never knew ... or forgot. Ask God to help you by His Spirit to love Jesus more at the end of 2021 than you do today. Talk to your mom and dad about how you might do this.

#2	Try really hard to make the same time every day.
#3	It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
#4	Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
#5	Sing a song or two together.
#6	Take prayer requests.

Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.

- #7 Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks
- #8 Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- #9 Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day
- #10 Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26


