Dear Children,

Have you ever read the story of Yertle the Turtle? It's a book by Dr. Seuss.

Let me remind you of the story. Yertle the Turtle is the "King of the Pond". But, he is not pleased with the rock that is his throne. So, he commands the other turtles to stack themselves beneath him so he can sit higher, see farther and make his kingdom bigger. A problem comes when the stacked turtles are in pain. One turtle, named Mack, is at the bottom of the pile and is in a lot of pain. When Mack asks Yertle for a break, Yertle yells at him to be quiet. Meanwhile, Yertle decides to grow his kingdom by adding more and more turtles to his throne. Mack now has even more weight on top of him. Now the weight, pain and hunger of the turtles at the bottom of the pile is growing. Again, Yertle tells Mack to be quiet and stop complaining. Finally, Mack decides that he has had enough. So, he burps, which shakes King Yertle's throne, so that he falls off his throne into the water, making him "King of the Mud". At last, all the other turtles are free.

The sermon this Sunday (Hebrews 4:14-16) is about a real throne and a real King. The real throne is a throne of grace. Upon this throne, is a real and true King, the Lord Jesus Christ. As King, Jesus brings light, life and love to all His people. He invites His people to pray to Him so that they "may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews 4:16).

When we pray, we are praying to the true King, Who sits upon the true throne. He gladly gives mercy and grace in answer to our prayers.



George and Phaedra Tolias Mission to the World Athens, Greece

George initially studied Electrical Engineering and then taught as a university professor. He graduated from the Greek Bible College in 2010 and married Phaedra who he met at the College. He completed a Master's in Theology at Westminster Seminary in Philadelphia while also pastoring a Greek Evangelical Church in New York. Now, he pastors the Glyfada church in the southern suburbs of Athens, which is ministering to Greek professionals and refugees.
