8. Do you look forward to being with Jesus forever and ever?

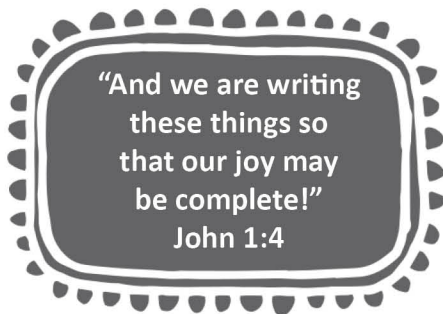
9. Will you talk to your mom and dad about this: Jesus came to give me life?

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS

- #1 Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
- #2 Try really hard to make the same time every day.



Meet Our Missionaries!



Trinity Presbyterian School Montgomery, AL

Trinity Presbyterian School was started by Trinity Presbyterian Church in 1970 with 200 students and 15 instructors as a ministry that would form a Christian world view in students, while also providing educational excellence in every way. Initially, the school classes met at Trinity Church in our Covenant Building and shared rooms with Sunday School classes. Within several years, the school was established as a separate nonprofit organization and moved to its current location at 1700 East Trinity Boulevard. Now, the state-of-the-art, multi-million dollar facility serves over 800 students with a faculty and staff over 100 people, and covers 32 acres with 186,147 square feet under roof. The school's mission is to glorify God by providing for students the highest quality, college-preparatory education, training them in the biblical world and life view, thus enabling them to serve God in spirit, mind, and body.

295 "Crown Him With Many Crowns"

Isn't it interesting to imagine a king crowned with not one, but many crowns! Can you think how wonderful it would be if every one of us put a "crown" on Jesus by making Him King in our own life? We sing of the "Lamb upon His throne", the "Lord of Love", the "Lord of peace", the "Lord of years". Verse 4 has some mighty big words!! Do you know that "Potentate" means the most high and powerful of Kings (King of Kings!)? The rolling spheres mean the planets in their orbits. And no matter what, praise of the almighty God will NOT fail, even if it looks like the forces of this world are winning.

#252 "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross"

Do you ever stop to take a real close look at the cross and what it meant for Jesus to have to die on that terrible instrument of torture for your very own sins? Many people don't like to think about the price Christ had to pay because those thoughts are just too painful. We might not be murderers or thieves, but we all have pride in our hearts. "Sorrow and love flow mingled down" means that as He was dying for us, He had the mixed emotions of love and sorrow at the same time. In the 4th verse, we see where Isaac Watts, the hymn writer, concludes that "love so amazing and divine demands our soul, our life, OUR ALL!"
