


Just a word from Mr. Curles

Dear Children,

This morning we are learning about the time Jesus healed a man who had been sick for 38 years. We don't know exactly what was wrong with him, but we know that he could not walk properly. Jesus healed him with just a few words. He said, "Stand up, pick up your mat, and walk." The Bible tells us that the man was healed immediately.

Jesus is kind, loving, and cares about all the things that are broken and painful in our lives. And Jesus wants us to bring to Him in prayer all the things that are painful to you so that He can help you with them. You can pray to Jesus about anything that is important to you – if it is important to you then it is important to Jesus. And this story reminds us that Jesus is very powerful – powerful enough even to heal a man who was crippled.

Do you have things that you sometimes talk to Jesus about? I hope that you know when you are hurting, worried, confused or need help that you can talk to Jesus. Even if you don't know what to say, you can just pray, "Jesus, please help me. Amen."

Mercy House Montgomery, AL

The Mercy House is a "Day House" providing a safe place for people to receive all kinds of help. It is a multifaceted ministry: a safe haven for homeless people to get a hot meal, take showers, and wash and dry their clothes; a safe place for children to stop in and receive an after school snack on their way home each day; a safe place in the community for our children to learn and play in a Godly environment. The facility has two full bathrooms with showers, washers and dryers available for families in need, a food pantry, clothes closet, and supervised internet access for school work and job searches. Pastor Ken Austin is the executive director and founder of Mercy House.

Music and Hymns

#691 "It Is Well With My Soul"

When Horatio Spafford wrote this hymn in 1873 he had just experienced a great loss in his family. He had already lost his son to Scarlet Fever and lost his wealth in the Great Chicago Fire, and in 1873 he lost his 4 daughters in a shipwreck. As he was on his way to meet his grieving wife he wrote this hymn, "It Is Well with My Soul." How do you react in times of trouble and sadness? Is your soul well in any circumstance? We should rest in the fact that the Holy Spirit is always with us and Jesus is always there to hear our prayers. This hymn is a great example of how, as Christians, we can have peace no matter what happens in our lives.

#378 "Here, O My Lord, I See Thee Face to Face"

This is a perfect hymn for communion. Most of you have probably not ever taken communion, but I am sure you have seen it and heard about it. We eat bread and drink grape juice that symbolize Jesus' body and blood shed on the cross for our sins. Taking communion is a very intimate moment with Jesus. Verse 4 says "Mine is the sin, but Thine the righteousness; mine is the guilt, but Thine the cleansing blood." Communion is a reminder that Christ died for our sins and we do it in remembrance of Him!
