



Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

I can remember when I was your age being scared of the dark. I wasn't always scared of the dark, but many times I was. We had woods that stretched way back into our backyard, and the windows to my room faced those woods. I think I was more scared of the shadows from the trees than the actual darkness.

And it's kind of funny, there was always a light way back at the end of those woods. I did not really like that light either.

At my grandmother's home in Charleston, Mississippi, I DID NOT WANT TO SLEEP ALONE in the room that was the darkest. My grandmother put a nightlight in that room, but it made a shadow in the ceiling that looked like two trains. My sisters, who are older than me, LOVED those shadows. Haha, I did not care too much for shadows.

This morning we will learn how Jesus gets rid of all the darkness in our hearts. When we are born, we are born in darkness (we are sinners). And the Bible describes people who are not Christians as people who live in darkness. But Jesus says, "I am the Light of the World." And that says a lot.

It says He is God. God's name is "I AM," and Jesus was saying, "I AM" is my Name and Who I am."

It says that He protects us, guides us, and provides for us.

Jesus is even called the "Sun of Righteousness," and that there is healing in His wings. Sort of strange words, aren't they? But how wonderful: He is like the SUN ... all that heat ... all that warmth ... all that healing.

He will heal you. It might be that He would heal you of a sickness. Sometimes He does; sometimes He doesn't; but He CAN. But when He heals your dark heart by coming to live in your heart, He scatters all that darkness away!

He loves us so much! He is the Light of the World, AND He cares about little ol' me and little ol' you. He loves us enough to come to this earth as a man, and conquer all the darkness (sin and our enemy, Satan) once and for all.

A Guide to Family Worship August 23- August 28

Suggested questions for mom and dad to use this week:

- 1. Tell stories about being afraid of the dark or perhaps a time when you found yourself in the dark.
- 2. Why not play a game of finding the darkest place in your house, and have everyone sit in that spot together for a while and talk about Jesus being the Light of the World. You might consider being in the dark, then turning the light on real fast; and do this over and over again, talking about how light dispels all the darkness. That is what Jesus does for us.
- 3. What songs and hymns speak to Jesus (and God) as Light? One hymn we will sing this morning is "Glorious Things of Thee Are Spoken." Sing that together and talk about Jesus being the "shade by day and light by night." Also, of course, there are simple songs like "This Little Light of Mine."
- 4. In what ways does Jesus as Light heal us? Read Micah 4:2. And teach your children specifically about Mr. Mac's conclusion to his sermon.
- 5. Play games in the car by looking at lights around town. Teach them about the sun, then read Micah 4:2. Make it fun to try to think of how many ways you can see light in different places and think of Jesus.

THE SIMPLEST OUTLINE FOR FAMILY TIME EVER!!! 10 EASY STEPS

- #1 Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
- #2 Try really hard to make the same time every day.
- #3 It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
- #4 Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
- #5 Sing a song or two together.
- #6 Take prayer requests.
- #7 Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
- #8 Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- #9 Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- #10 Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26

The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.


