

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

But they also must have a sensitive side; thoughtful; compassionate. Afterall, they have to go after wandering sheep. They have to raise lambs to become sheep. They have to take care of sick sheep. They have to watch their diets. And they have to make sure no sheep is turned over on its back because sheep cannot get up on their own if they fall over on their backs.

Jesus is likened to a shepherd. And I can see both sides of shepherd in Him, can't you? Bold; fearless; tough; commands authority; can handle any wild beast (after all, He MADE wild beasts!)

But how compassionate our Shepherd Jesus is. He is slow to get angry. He takes care of us when we are sick. He gives us food to eat, air to breathe ... the Bible says that it is in Him we move, live and have our being. In other words, He is everything to us.

We are sheep who need a Shepherd.

Sheep will easily wander off, and we are very prone to wander off. There is a hymn that says that: Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it; prone to leave the God I love. We leave Him by not trusting Him, not worshipping Him, not seeking Him in prayer and the Bible. But He is our gentle, patient shepherd who comes after us and takes us back home to Him.

Jesus came to die for His sheep. The Father sent Him to die for His sheep. And we praise Him that we are one of His sheep.

Suggested questions for mom and dad to use this week:

- 1. Mom and dad, a great discussion with children is what "pursue" means. And talk about how God pursues us. We can be so stubborn, but He patiently comes after us, seeking, rescuing us to take us back home to Him.
- 2. Why does Jesus love sinners like us? Why did He die for enemies like us? How much does Jesus love us sheep? See Isaiah 53:6.
- 3. When have you seen someone be very protective? When did you see someone jump into action to protect someone or some thing? How can you liken that to Jesus as our Good Shepherd (on a child's level)?
- 4. When we say Jesus knows us, to what extent? Everything? Talk about it.
- 5. Why did Jesus have to die for us?



He asked Jesus to "feed us," "seek us when we go astray," "befriend us," and "receive us." In John chapter 10, Jesus says, "I lay down my life for the sheep." Jesus not only feeds us, seeks us out, befriends us, and received us with open arms, but He also died for us. He gave up His life so that we could have eternal life with Him. Isn't it wonderful to be a sheep? Ask Jesus to be your shepherd and to guide your life!
