


Just a word from Mrs. Stacy

Dear Children,

Today's sermon text is taken from the New Testament book of John. A little background on John: he was one of Jesus's 12 disciples and was also called "the disciple whom Jesus loved." John saw the things Jesus did and knew him very well. The book of John is the last of the 4 Gospels. The disciple John also wrote 3 letters in the New Testament and another very well known New Testament book. Can you name them?

In today's text taken from John 9, the disciples bring a man who had been born blind to Jesus. The disciples assumed that since this man was born blind, either he or his parents must have sinned. Jesus tells the disciples that neither had sinned and then restores the man's eyesight. Jesus also tells them that "...this happened so that the work of God might be displayed in his life."

Listen carefully today as Mr. Curles answers questions about our brokenness and how Jesus provides the healing for our brokenness.



Meet Our Missionaries!



Argyris and Dina Petrou Athens, Greece

Dr. Argyris Petrou is a professor at the Greek Bible College where he has helped prepare many young men and women for ministry in Greece and southeastern Europe. He is an ordained teaching elder of the Greek Evangelical Church, with pastoral experience in Toronto, Canada, Piraeus, Greece and several church plants in Athens, Greece. He is part of the leadership of the Greek Evangelical Alliance and is a published author through the Greek publishing house, O LOGOS. Following years of being a pastor's wife and a mom, Dina began ministering to women trapped in the brothels in downtown Athens. Recently, she founded and now serves as the director of Damaris House, a ministry providing safe housing and a recovery program to survivors of trafficking and exploitation. This ministry empowers women to find freedom, walk through their journey of healing, and reintegrate into society.

Argyris and Dina Petrou have three sons: Mark, Erik, and Erastos. Mark ministers in a Roma Gypsy community with Child Evangelism Fellowship. Eric is part of the church planting leadership team of Neos Kosmos Church in Athens. Erastos is a college student. Trinity's partnership with a half dozen or more Greek pastors and church planters began through our friendship with Argyris in 2008. He has been our host for several missions trips to Athens and, in turn, visited Trinity Church several times.

Music and Hymns

#660 "O God Beyond All Praising"
