


Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children.

While most children your age are thinking about Halloween this week, we want to focus on something much more important: **The Reformation.**

Over five hundred years ago \sim October 31, 1517 \sim a monk by the name of Martin Luther nailed 95 complaints he had against the church to the door of Whittenburg Castle. The church had become very, very abusive. It was not only not honoring God, it was taking advantage of God's people.

When we celebrate **the Reformation**, we are celebrating a number of things perhaps you and I take for granted everyday of our lives. For example: *Do you like to read?* Your parents have the freedom to teach you to read due in part to **the Reformation**.

Do you like the freedoms we have in America? You can thank God for raising up men like Martin Luther in 1517 to take a stand for His Word.

Do we, in America, enjoy freedom of speech, freedom to write, and freedom to believe what we want to believe? Sure we do. And that is the result of **the Reformation**.

Do you like singing hymns with the congregation? We do that because of what came out of **the Reformation**.

Do you like to be able to read the Bible in your own language? Well, before the Reformation people didn't read the Bible in their own language.

Do you like listening to sermons as I preach God's Word to you? That is because of **the Reformation.**

Do you enjoy knowing the answer to the question: "What must I do to be saved?" Then you can thank God this morning for men like Martin Luther and for **the Reformation** that make it possible for the "average person" \sim like you and me \sim to know the answer to that question!

Do you like worship in our church because it is serious, simple and very reverent? You can thank men of the Reformation like John Calvin, Zwingly, Bucer, and Bullenger who preached for people to worship God the way that God insisted on being worshipped!

We celebrate **the Reformation** this morning in our service. And when you see the Word of God and the banners as they process in, and hear the music and the preaching, you can know why we are doing all this: we are thankful to God for giving us what we have in our church we call Trinity Presbyterian Church.

- 1. Mom and Dad, please read to your children the letter from Mr. Mac in this edition of the Children's Bulletin. Hopefully, it will spark some discussion and/or some good things to thank God for on this Reformation Sunday.
- 2. Can your children name the Five Solas of the Reformation? Can you? LOL. They have been on the banners in the sanctuary this month and processed in this morning.

Sola Scriptura = Scripture Alone Sola Gratia = Grace Alone Sola Fide = Faith Alone Solo Christos = Christ Alone Sola Deo Gloria = God's Glory Alone

And these cries of the Reformation for which many men, women and children gave their lives, inspire us to think: Scripture alone teaches me that I am saved by grace alone through faith alone in Jesus Christ alone to God's glory alone.

- 3. What does it mean to say that I am secure in the hands of Jesus and the Father. That He will never let me go. That no one can snatch me from His grip.
- 4. What does it mean to say, "Jesus must increase; I must decrease?" And what are some godly habits that might bolster that in our lives?
- 5. How might your family celebrate Reformation Sunday today? And remembering that tomorrow is All Saints Day? Suggestion: remembering with great reverence and solitude those who have gone before us in the last year; calling a widow to tell them you love them and to pray for them; talking about the sanctity and dignity of human life.



Anastasia and Mark Petrou Child Evangelism Fellowship Athens, Greece

Mark Petrou is one of three sons of Trinity missionaries Argyris and Dina Petrou who live in Athens, Greece. Mark's father, Argyris, teaches at the Greek Bible College and trains people to be pastors and teachers. Mark's mother, Dina, has a ministry for women in their city called Community House Damaris. After completing university studies in Physics, mandatory national military service and earning a degree from the Greek Bible College, Mark volunteered and then was accepted as a full time staff member with Child Evangelism Fellowship in Athens. He spends four days a week tutoring and evangelizing children in Petaluda, which is a Roma (Gypsy) community. He also leads and participates in other CEF events in Athens and surrounding locations. He and Anastasia were married two years ago. Anastasia is also part of the ministry in Petaluda where she focuses on preschool aged children.
