



Just a word from Mr. Michael

My friends,

Here is part of a story which I plan to tell in the sermon on November 7. It is a story about John Paton. Paton was a Presbyterian missionary. The people to whom he went lived on the New Hebrides islands, which is close to Australia. The people were known as cannibals. Perhaps you can ask your mom or dad "what is a cannibal?"

When Paton arrived on the islands, the people on the islands did not like him! They wanted him to leave. After being there only a short time, the natives decided that if he would not leave them alone, then they would kill him. His life was constantly in danger. Sometimes he and his family had to hide from the natives. But God protected him and his family.

Finally, a few of the natives became Christians. They wanted to help Paton translate the Bible into the language of the people of the islands. When the people had a Bible in their language, then things began to change. They wanted to help Paton do his mission work.

One time, a terrible storm (a strong hurricane) came. It was so powerful that it destroyed the villages on the islands, including the home of the missionaries. But a strange thing happened. At this time, the people of the islands loved Paton and his family so much, they helped him rebuild his home because they wanted him to stay. They wanted him to continue to tell them about the Lord Jesus Christ.

Years later, a famous preacher in London, named Charles Spurgeon, called Paton "The King of the Cannibals"! Spurgeon called him that because Paton brought the Gospel of King Jesus Christ to people who did not know Him.


