


Good morning boys and girls!!

Thanksgiving is past and it's time to start preparing for what, I bet, is your favorite time of year...Christmas!! It's my favorite time of year too!!

If you haven't already, you and your family will probably start preparing for Christmas very soon. What are some things you and your family do to prepare for Christmas? Taking decorations down from the attic or storage, buying a Christmas tree, decorating the Christmas tree, singing Christmas carols and hymns, planning a trip to visit grandparents and relatives, and cooking your favorite Christmas treats, might be just a few of the things you do to prepare for Christmas.

This Sunday marks the first Sunday of Advent. Do you know what Advent is? Christians use the four Sundays and weeks of Advent to prepare and remember the real meaning of Christmas. Heather and Marcus Rudd Isaiah 55 Reynosa, Mexico

Marcus and Heather joined the Isaiah 55 staff in October 2016 along with their two kids, Calder and Samantha. Their calling to ministry on the border started with short-terms trips they took from their churches in San Antonio and then Georgetown, Texas. It was through one of these short-term trips in 2013 that the Rudds became acquainted with Isaiah 55 Ministries and felt a specific call to join the missionary team there full time. Soon after, they began the transition to full time ministry work on the border.

Currently, Marcus uses his background in art and construction in managing Isaiah 55's trade school for deaf children as well as small scale manufacturing projects to teach work skills to the deaf students as well as hearing members of the local neighborhood community. Heather uses her background as a church administrator and professional organizer in the Isaiah 55 office and is involved with the community outreach program and girls Bible study.

Music and Hymns

#196 "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus"

This is a hymn about the joy and expectation of Jesus' birth and the joy and expectation of His second coming! Verse 4 says "Born Thy people to deliver, born a child and yet a king, born to reign in us forever, now Thy gracious kingdom bring." Jesus' birth was prophesied hundreds of years before He was born. The Jews were anticipating a Messiah to be born of a virgin and that is exactly what happened. Now, 2000 years after His death, we await His second coming where we will get to see Him face to face. Isn't that exciting? Praise Him for his birth, praise Him for his death, praise Him for his resurrection, and praise Him that He is coming again!

#194 "O Come, O Come Emmanuel"

Each stanza of this ancient hymn concentrates on a different biblical name for Christ. Jesus is Emmanuel, "God with us"; Wisdom from on high; Desire of nations; Lord of might; Rod of Jesse; Dayspring; and Key of David. This tune is based on "plainsong", which was used in the church during medieval times. For you young musicians, notice how the rhythm is quite irregular and therefore sounds rather free-flowing instead of a strict "1-2-3-4". The minor key makes the tune sound rather haunting and distant. Aren't we glad that Jesus is no longer distant from us if we have claimed Him as our Savior this Christmas?
