







Just a word from Mr. Kurt


Children,

To the right, you can see a famous statue called, "The Thinker." It was made out of bronze by a sculptor named Auguste Rodin. I think it's amazing that artists can create such amazing works of art like that. Even though it looks quite life-like, the sculpture is not alive. If you were to cut it, it would not bleed. It doesn't need air to breathe. It doesn't have ideas or dreams. It's created in the image of a person, but it is not actually made of the same stuff as a person. The bible tells us that we are created in God's image. We share some of his attributes, like being able to create and think for



instance. But we are not made of the same stuff as God. We are his creations. This is what makes Jesus so special. He is God's only begotten son. Jesus wasn't created. He has always existed. He is made of the same stuff as God. At Christmas we celebrate that he came down and was born. That means he's made of the same stuff as God AND the same stuff as us. He is fully God and he is fully man. That makes him unique. That's also what makes him able to live a sinless life and to die for our sins on the cross. 

Reformed Youth Ministries (RYM)

- Creating, gathering, and recommending written resources for the church that are designed for a teenage audience.
- Encouraging youth and family ministers in their significant callings.
- Providing a church consulting service in the area of youth and family ministry, as well as a "head-hunter" service for churches looking for qualified youth ministers.

Music and Hymns

#208 "O Come All Ye Faithful"

This hymn tells the story of the shepherds coming to see Jesus. An angel appeared to the shepherds and told them that Jesus had been born. Then a large group of angels sang "Glory to God in the highest." The shepherds went to "adore Him" and they went and told everyone about what they had seen! Have you told everyone you know about Jesus? Share the Christmas story!

#194 "O Come, O Come Emmanuel"

Each stanza of this ancient hymn concentrates on a different biblical name for Christ. Jesus is Emmanuel, "God with us"; Wisdom from on high; Desire of nations; Lord of might; Rod of Jesse; Dayspring; and Key of David. This tune is based on "plainsong", which was used in the church during medieval times. For you young musicians, notice how the rhythm is quite irregular and therefore sounds rather free-flowing instead of a strict "1-2-3-4". The minor key makes the tune sound rather haunting and distant. Aren't we glad that Jesus is no longer distant from us if we have claimed Him as our Savior this Christmas?
