

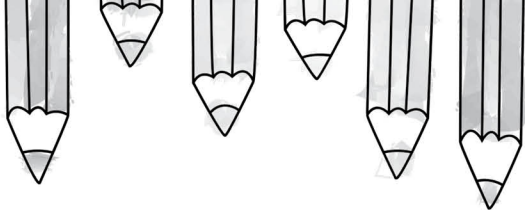

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

A friend said to Dwight L. Moody: “The world has yet to see what God can do with a man fully consecrated (dedicated; devoted) to him.” That changed his life forever. He took that in as his motto for life.

Another man named George Mueller was “the father of the orphanage.” He started 10,000 orphanages in his life time. And he was a remarkable man of prayer. Many times the orphans would not even know if they would have breakfast, lunch or dinner, but after George prayed, God provided – every time!! He kept a journal and wrote all about it. He prayed for over 63 years for eight of his friends to become Christians. All but one were saved before George died. But do you know that at his funeral, that friend fell on the ground and cried out, “God, have mercy on me a sinner!” And he was converted.

You probably also need to know too that this morning we will recognize some men who will serve us as elders and deacons. These are men who are gifted at shepherding us and serving us. These men (the elders) teach us, watch over us, pray for us, run to us when we are in trouble, are present when tragedy comes, and are behind the scenes praying and leading our church when we don’t even know it. They are shepherds, and Jesus is the Chief Shepherd.

The other men (the deacons) are servants – a very high calling! Jesus was the ultimate servant, and these men act like Jesus before us. They take care of our church building and grounds; they make sure we spend our money faithfully; they help people in need; they show mercy to those who need mercy; they are very godly, spiritual men who put others ahead of themselves; they help the elderly and the widows and the poor; and these men too do so much behind the scenes that we never see ... but they do it.

It’s actually a very exciting day in the life of our church. Communion is served tonight!

George and Phaedra Tolia **MTW (Athens, Greece)**

George initially studied Electrical Engineering and then taught as a University Professor. He graduated from the Greek Bible College in 2010 and married Phaedra who he met at the college. He completed a Masters of Theology at Westminster Seminary in Philadelphia while also pastoring a Greek Evangelical Church in New York. Now, he pastors the Glyfada Church in the southern suburbs of Athens, which is ministering to Greek professionals and refugees.
