

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

This morning, the adult Sunday school classes got a chance to hear from Steve and Sherri Letchford who work in Zambia and Kenya, and Jonah and Jennifer who work in Asia.

Steve and Sherri have served in Zambia and Kenya since 2001. They have been at AIC Kijabe Hospital since 2006. Steve is a medical doctor and serves as the Medical Director at the Hospital which has over 360 beds. He also leads a team of people who are developing and fielding an Information Technology solution to enable African hospitals and small clinics in very low income communities to manage their patients, staff and inventory. It is being field tested under the name Banda Health for hospitals and Banda Go for small clinics. Sherri is a physical therapist, and works with the Kijabe Hospital physical therapy department. She teaches, mentors, and disciples new physical therapists. Their four children are adults with their youngest son in medical school. Trinity Church has supported the Letchfords since 1998.

Jonah and Jennifer live in and minister within a nation that is 99% Muslim so we don't identify their real names or actual location. Their country is ranked by some Christian organizations within the top 5 of all nations for extreme religious persecution against Christians. Radical Islamic factions present the most visible threat, but the most common sources of danger for converts are their own families, since conversion from Islam is seen as cause for shame or even blasphemy. In spite of this hostility, the church exists there and even meets regularly and openly in some places while more covertly in others. Jonah fills preaching, teaching and discipleship roles and travels frequently to meet with churches and groups of believers. Trinity Church began supporting Jonah and Jennifer in 1991.



Isaiah 25:6-8 says "On this mountain [Zion] the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food...And He will...swallow up death forever; and the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces, and the reproach of His people He will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken." We sing this hymn on communion Sundays because communion reminds us of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross for us. He died on the cross so that we can join Him one day forever in a place where there is no death and there are no tears.

Written by Isaac Watts, this one dates back to the year 1707. Read the story of the invited guests in Luke 14 to better understand this hymn. The gathering place (perhaps the church) of saved Christians is what he refers to as "a sweet and awesome place." And were it not for Christ's drawing us to Him, we would be lost forever!
