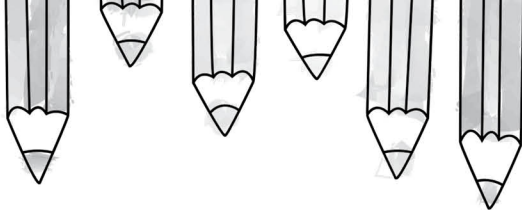

Just a word from Mr. Mac

Dear Children,

I am guessing you know what today is, right?

It is MOTHER'S DAY!!

And I am going to give you an idea of what you can do for your mother today, but first I want to remind you of what is more important than Mother's Day is that it is the Lord's Day; more important than honoring your mother is honoring God in worship.

Interestingly enough, we can honor God by honoring our mothers (and fathers).

But I don't want you to miss the importance of what is a tradition at Trinity Church on Mother's Day. We bring young people (not much older than you) into a new relationship with the Church so that they can now take the Lord's Supper; we recognize our young people who have graduated from High School; like always, we preach the Word; and, we take the Lord's Supper!! Always on Mother's Day in our church.

Now, let me tell you a way that you can show you mom just how much you love her. It will sound strange at first, but if you will think about it, it is a pretty cool way to show her that you are thankful for all she has done for you and how she sacrifices for you.

I want you to go home; fill up a large pot of very warm water; put some liquid soap in it; take it to your mother (hopefully completely surprising her); have a towel with you; dip the towel in the soapy water; wring it out; then take the damp towel and wash your mother's feet!!

When you do that, you are telling your mom: *I love you. I thank you for "washing my feet" all day every day. I know you work hard, so I want to make your feet feel better. But when I do this, I want it to make your heart feel better because you will know that not only do I love you, but Jesus loves you.*

I hope you have a great day, but I also hope your mother has a fantastic day!!!



Founded in 1986, Family Promise was originally known as the Interfaith Hospitality Network. It was launched by Karen Olson as a way to combat family homelessness in Union County, New Jersey. Under Karen's leadership, Family Promise has grown to a national nonprofit serving more than 90,000 homeless people annually and has 200,000 volunteers and more than 6,000 congregations of all faiths.

Family Promise of Montgomery was started in 2006. Extensive case management, fellowship and prayer allows Family Promise of Montgomery to have an 87% success rate of moving families into stable housing with an average of 54 days in the program.
