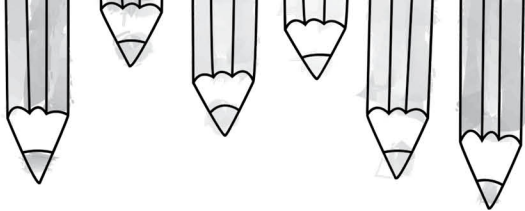

Dear Children,

Do you know what an orphan is? An orphan is a child who is no longer with their parents. Can you imagine how frightening or sad you'd be if you didn't have your mom or dad any more? Who would read you stories before bed? Who would cook you breakfast? Who would give you a band-aid when you skinned your knee? Who would help you figure out your math homework? Our parents do so much for us and teach us so much. It's not fun to think about how hard it would be to not have them in our lives. Jesus' disciples were worried and afraid. He had been telling them for quite a while that he would need to go away. They didn't want to think about how it would be when he was gone. But in John 14:18, Jesus promises them that he will not leave them as orphans. Jesus promises his disciples (and us), that if they trusted in him, he would send the Helper, the Holy Spirit, to dwell in us. So if we trust in Jesus, we know that we are never alone. 

TRANSLATION

John and Erin Rujak Bible Translation

In 2017, Trinity Church committed to support a Bible translation effort for the Rujak people who are an unreached Asian population with no known Jesus followers or churches among the 500,000 people who live there. Initial efforts were focused on establishing a written language with the help of local people and linguistic experts in the US. John and Erin lived among this population and were the lead translators. Over a four-year time, they translated key scripture passages from Genesis through Revelation. Several of the translators have come to faith in Jesus and begun meeting for prayer and discussion. John and his family recently arrived in the US for home assignment. Two other families will be arriving within two months to settle in nearby villages and begin learning the language. The long-term goal of this project is to see an indigenous, self-sustaining church established, followed by a group of churches that will bring a gospel witness to the larger culture and, in turn, evangelize other related people groups with similar languages.

"A Mighty Fortress Is Our God"

God is indeed a mighty fortress! Do you know what a fortress is? A fortress is a safe place that protects those who are inside. You can imagine a castle with high walls and a moat surrounding it with guards and cannons ready to defend it at the first sign of an enemy. God is our fortress. Psalm 18:2 says "The Lord is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold." If you are in the Lord, nothing can harm you. The Lord will keep you safe. As a Christian, you are a son or daughter of the King of kings and you remain safe within His fortress. Praise God!

"Like a River Glorious"

This song proclaims "they who trust Him wholly find Him wholly true." Do you wholly trust God? When you trust God you can rest in Him and know that He is going to handle every worry you may have. Verse 2 says that there is a peace God can give where there is "not a surge of worry, not a shade of care." When you are worried about something, put your trust in God and ask Him to help you.
