

So, God has given us many blessings, but He has also allowed many hard things in this life because of what we call a “fallen world,” a world influenced by sin. And there are people in the world who do not love God, and they can be very mean to us.

BUT, GOD THE SON SENT GOD THE SPIRIT TO HELP US!!

God did not leave us alone. We are never alone when we are in the dark or when we fall off our bikes or when someone is sick.
We are never alone.

Ask your mom or dad to read Psalm 121 to you. Maybe they could read it to you when you are going to bed at night.

Ask your mom or dad to share with you stories in their lives when things were hard, but they realized that they were never alone.

Learn this name of God: **Jehovah Shammah**. It means, “The God Who is There.” His very name tells us Who He is, and He is a God who never leaves us. He sent His Holy Spirit to live in us and come alongside us and to remind us of God’s great promises.

Suggested Questions for Mom and Dad to use this Week:

1. Mom and/or dad, read my letter to the children. Help them through it because it asks them to think of not only many blessings from God but also some of the harder things in their lives.

2. When you read the letter, you'll see three things to do with your children:

a) Read Psalm 121 to your children

b) Tell them stories of times in your own life when it was hard, but God was always with you.

c) Teach them the name of God: *Jehovah Shammah*. "The God/LORD Who is There."

3. Share favorite Bible verses this week.

4. Pray in unison the Lord's Prayer every day this week.

5. Sing! Sing together! *In this day and age there is everything from hymnals to your playlists and YouTube. Find great hymns of the faith (hymns you might have grown up on) and hymns we sing on Sunday nights. Sing them. Learn them. Enjoy them. Memorize them. Cling to them.*


