



Mercy House Montgomery, Alabama

Mercy House is a "Day House" providing a safe place for people in need. This ministry provides a safe haven for the homeless, allowing them to get a hot meal, take showers, and wash their clothes. Mercy House is a safe place for children to stop in and receive an after-school snack and play in a godly environment. The facility has two full bathrooms with showers, washers and dryers, a food pantry, a clothes closet, and supervised internet access for schoolwork and job searches.

Music and Hymns

"The Power of the Cross"

Have you ever thought about "every bitter thought and every evil deed" being in that crown of thorns that pierced Jesus' head as he hung on the cross? Have you ever thought about your own name being "written in [His] wounds?" It is almost too much to bear, but that is exactly what the Bible says! Peter 2:24 says "He Himself bore our sins in His body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By His wounds you have been healed." Isaiah 49:16 says that our names are written in His hands and John 10:28-29 says that no one can snatch us out of Jesus' hands or The Father's hands. We are safe in His hands and we are free by the power of the cross and the blood that was shed for your salvation.

"Christ Is Made the Gure Foundation"

Isaiah prophesied about Jesus being a "cornerstone for a sure foundation" hundreds of years before Jesus was born.

Psalm 118:22, also written long before Jesus was born, says, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." This is accurate because Jesus was rejected by His own people, the Jews, while He was on earth. Jesus actually quoted Psalm 118:22 in Matthew 21:42 while He was still alive on earth. Isn't that amazing how we can see prophecies about Jesus in the Old Testament before He was born and then see them fulfilled in the New Testament!
