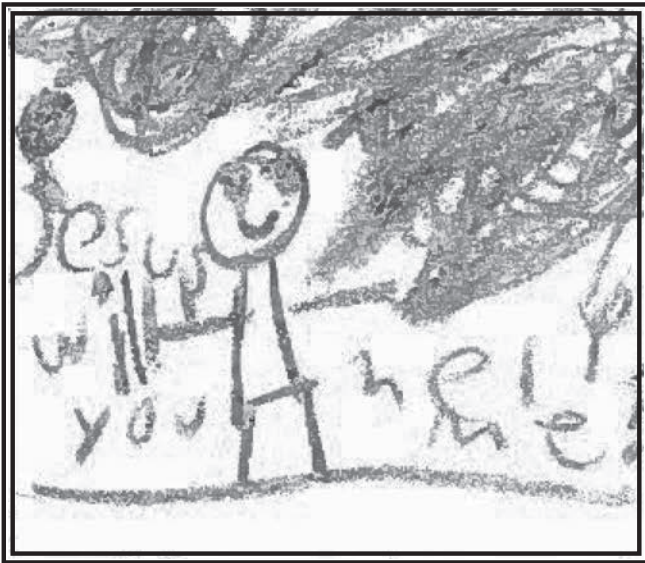


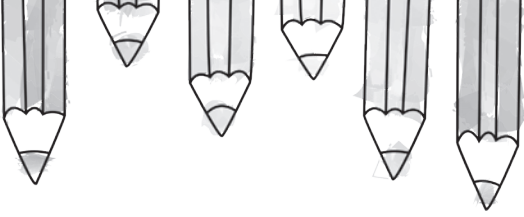

Just a word from Mr. Kurt

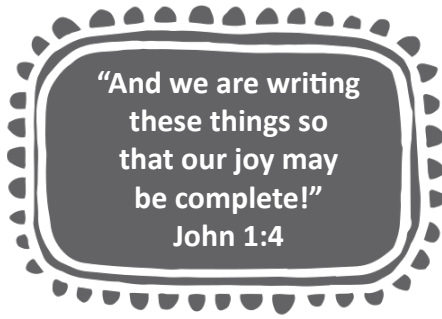

Children,

In all four Gospel accounts, the writers mention a man who seems to appear and disappear out of nowhere at Jesus' crucifixion. His name is Joseph of Arimathea. He isn't one of the twelve disciples. He isn't someone we meet anywhere else in the story of Jesus' life. He simply shows up and offers to bury Jesus' body in his family's tomb. Like the boy who gave Jesus the five loaves and two fish, Joseph of Arimathea simply offered what he had. Jesus doesn't expect us to be exceptional or extraordinary. He simply asks us to be faithful and willing to serve however we can. I wonder what gifts and abilities you have? How could you be faithful to God with what he has given you? Ask your parents how you might be a simple and faithful servant like Joseph of Arimathea. I'm excited to see how God will use you to help others and spread the good news of Jesus Christ.

10 EASY STEPS

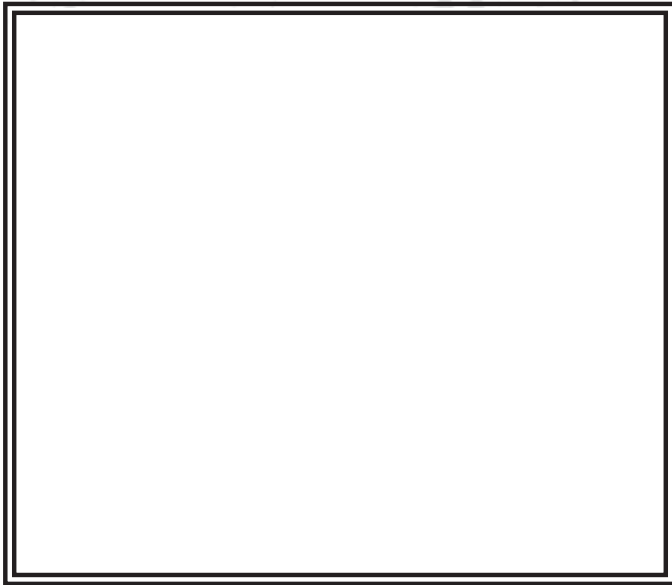

"Jesus Paid It All"

This hymn is about Jesus dying for our sins and paying for our sins even though we do not deserve it. The refrain proclaims "Jesus paid it all, all to Him I owe; sin had left a crimson stain, He washed it white as snow." We are dirty and covered in sin, but God sees us as clean and holy because Jesus has cleansed us. Verse 3 says "I'll wash my garments white in the blood of Calv'ry's Lamb." Jesus was the final Passover lamb, the ultimate sacrifice. You are never too sinful for Jesus. No matter what you have done, He has the power to cleanse you and make you clean in the sight of God the Father.

"A Mighty Fortress Is Our God"

God is indeed a mighty fortress! Do you know what a fortress is? A fortress is a safe place that protects those who are inside. You can imagine a castle with high walls and a moat surrounding it with guards and cannons ready to defend it at the first sign of an enemy. God is our fortress. Psalm 18:2 says "The Lord is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold."
