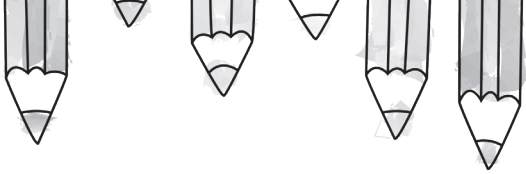

Just a word from Mr. Kurt

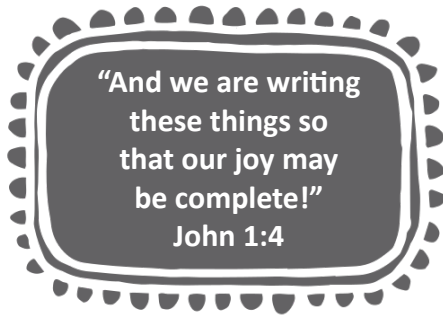

Children,

You can tell a lot about someone by what they are wearing. If they have a helmet and shoulder pads on, they are probably playing football. If they have a badge and blue uniform, they are probably police officers. If they are wearing a tutu and point shoes, they are probably ballerinas. You may even have a uniform that you wear to school. What we wear tells the world something about who we are and what we do. In our passage this morning, Paul is describing about how Christians should dress. But Paul isn't writing about shirts or dresses. He is writing about our behavior. He is encouraging Christians to "put on" Christ and to "take off" evil deeds. Just like an astronaut wears a spacesuit to prepare for launch, Paul wants us to "wear" righteousness. How do we "put on" Jesus? We put on Jesus by repenting from our sin and by living as if he is coming back soon. We put on Jesus when we pray for mercy from God and give mercy to people who have wronged us. We put on Jesus when we follow God's commands instead of insisting on our own way. Talk to your parents and ask them to see a picture of when they were young and what they wore. Ask them how you might "put on" Christ at home and at school. Always remember that we don't behave so that Jesus will love us. We do good things because Jesus has loved us.

- #10** Dad, pray this over your children: Numbers 6:24–26

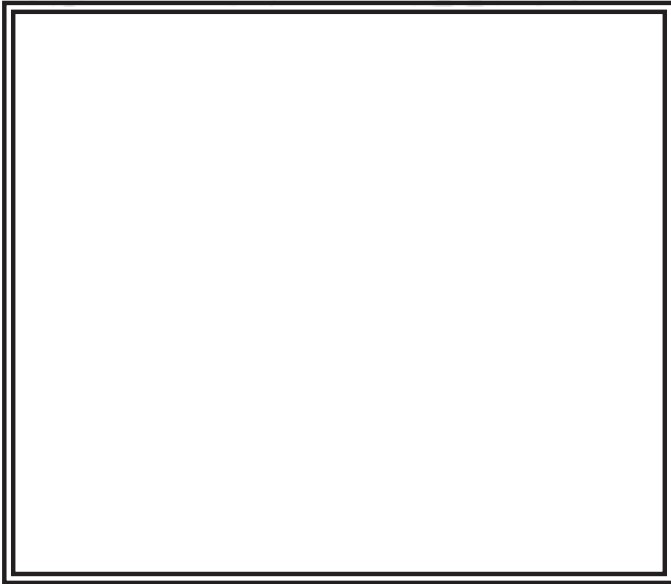
