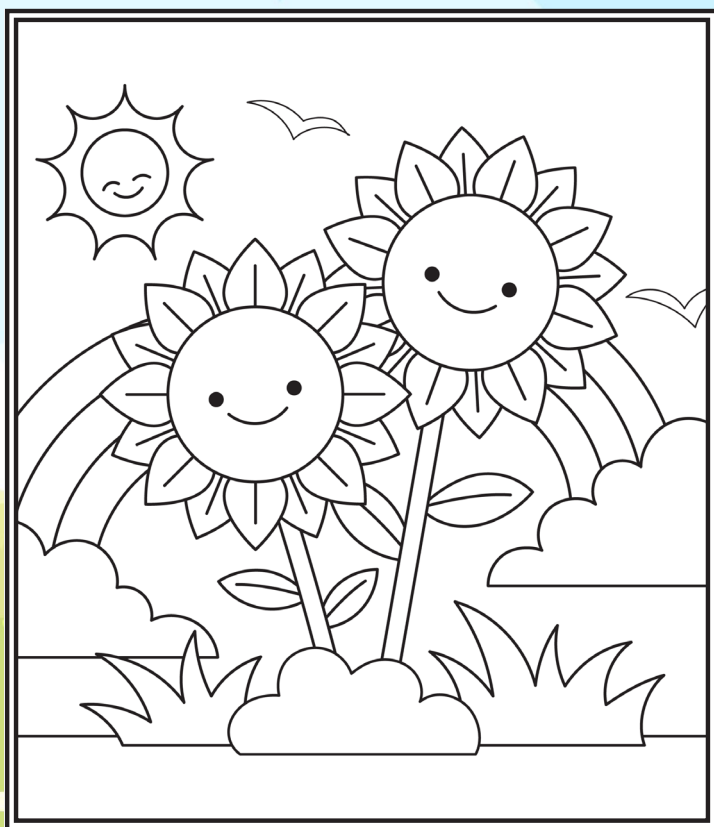

# A GUIDE TO *Family Worship*



## **The simplest outline for family time ever! 10 Easy Steps**

1. Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
2. Try really hard to make the same time every day.
3. It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
4. Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
5. Sing a song or two together.
6. Take prayer requests.
7. Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
8. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
9. Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
10. Dad, pray this over your children: Number 6:24-26

## **Life on Wheels Alabama**

Life on Wheels provides free, mobile ultrasound imaging to women. They use the power of ultrasound to serve women, save babies, and share Jesus. Life on Wheels serves hundreds of clients each year by administering pregnancy tests and ultrasounds. In 2022, they served 1,040 clients and since they began in December of 2016 in Montgomery, they have served 6,033 clients.

This ministry has seen many women choose to have their baby after seeing her baby on ultrasound. Life on Wheels has also seen many clients make professions of faith in Jesus Christ.

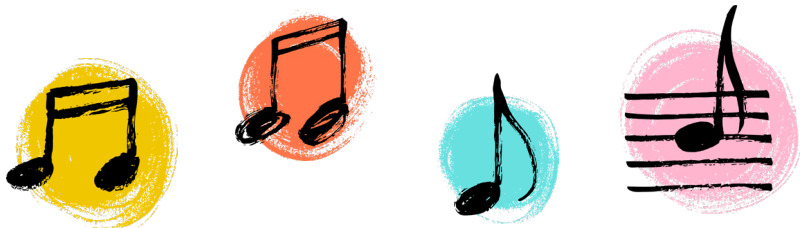

## **“Christ is Made the Sure Foundation”**

Isaiah prophesied about Jesus being a “cornerstone for a sure foundation” hundreds of years before Jesus was born. Psalm 118:22, also written long before Jesus was born, says, “The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.” This is accurate because Jesus was rejected by His own people, the Jews, while He was on earth. Jesus actually quotes Psalm 118:22 in Matthew 21:42 while He was still alive on earth. Isn’t that amazing how we can see prophecies about Jesus in the Old Testament before He was born and then see them fulfilled in the New Testament!

## **“The Church’s One Foundation”**

This hymn also speaks of the church as a city with a foundation built on Christ the Lord. What else do you see the church being compared to in verse 1 of this hymn? Verse 2 then tells us how the elect are really one people bound by one holy name, one holy food, and one hope, even though we might live all over the world. Verse 3 tells how the world views the church and describes the hardships we, the saints, must endure, but then assures us that we, the church, shall never perish!
