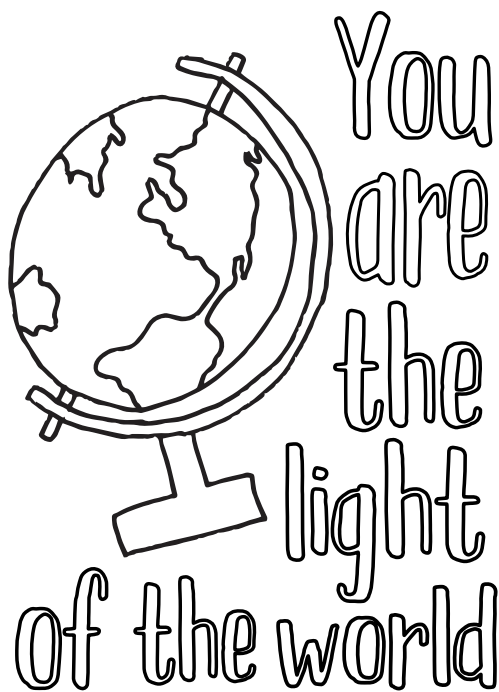

A GUIDE TO *Family Worship*



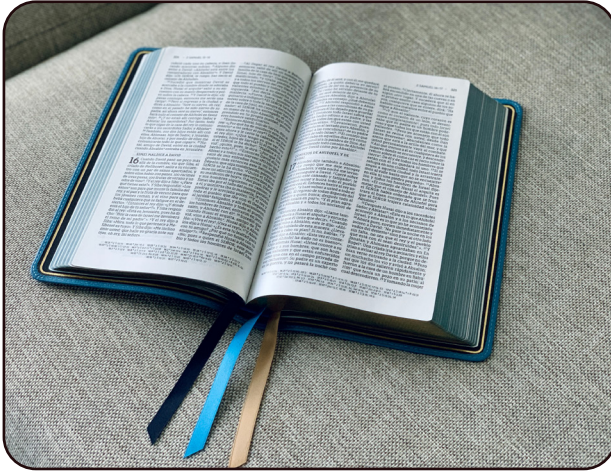
The simplest outline for family time ever! 10 Easy Steps

1. Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
2. Try really hard to make the same time every day.
3. It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
4. Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
5. Sing a song or two together.
6. Take prayer requests.
7. Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
8. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
9. Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
10. Dad, pray this over your children: Number 6:24-26

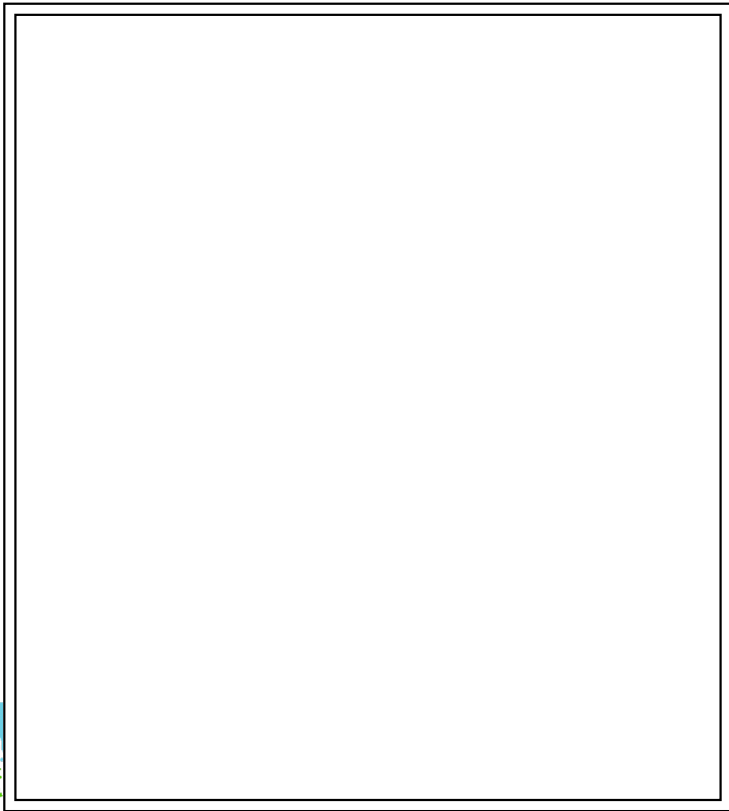
John and Erin Rujak Translation Project

The Rujak people are an unreached Asian population of approximately 500,000 people. John and Erin live among these people and have focused on establishing a written language. This tedious process involves associating sounds with letters, creating written words, and identifying normal sentence structures. With help from linguistic experts, they are gradually translating portions of the Bible. Their long-term project goal is to see indigenous, self-sustaining churches established that will bring a gospel witness to the larger culture and evangelize people groups with similar languages.

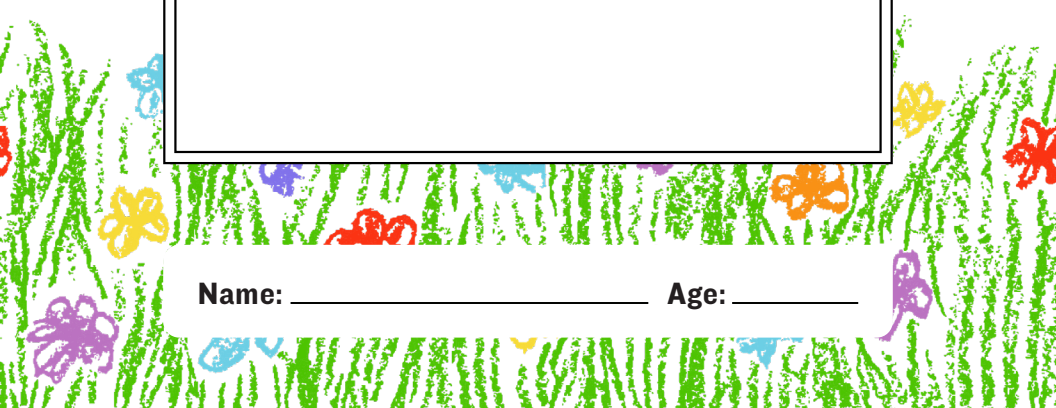
Sermon Art

Music and Hymns



“Join All the Glorious Names”

Isaac Watts originally wrote 12 stanzas for this hymn and included 17 names for Christ. He wrote several hymns of the same theme but finally decided, “Earth is too narrow to express His worth, His glory, or His grace.” See how many names you can find in this one, and get your parents to check and see if you are correct!

“All Hail the Power of Jesus’ Name!”

Philippians 2:9 says that Jesus’ name is above every other name. There are places in the Bible where people were healed simply by having faith in Jesus. We pray in His name because there is power in His name. We are baptized in His name. Demons have been cast out in His name. In the Christmas story, the book of Matthew quotes the prophet Isaiah in saying, “Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call His name Immanuel.” Immanuel means “God with us.” Jesus, which is Yeshua in its original Hebrew form, means “He will save or the Lord saves.” Jesus was a fairly common name when Jesus was born, but He was and is the only one who is “God with us,” and it is only by His name that we are saved!
