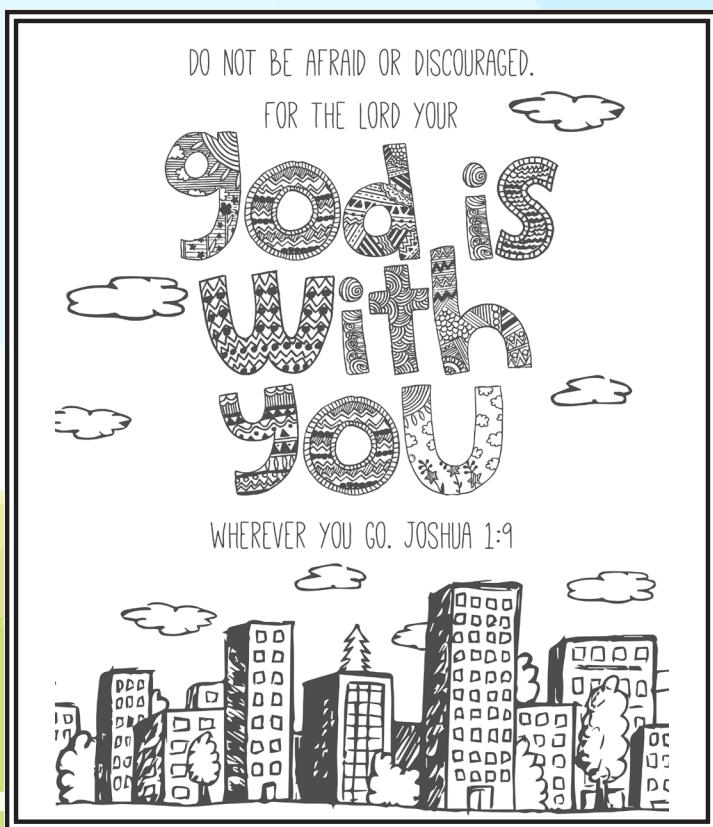

# A GUIDE TO *Family Worship*



## **The simplest outline for family time ever! 10 Easy Steps**

1. Just make sure you gather once a day as a family.
2. Try really hard to make the same time every day.
3. It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
4. Read a Bible verse. Maybe a devotional.
5. Sing a song or two together.
6. Take prayer requests.
7. Pray. (Daddy, your children NEED to hear you pray.) Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
8. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
9. Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
10. Dad, pray this over your children: Number 6:24-26

### **Greg and Julieann**

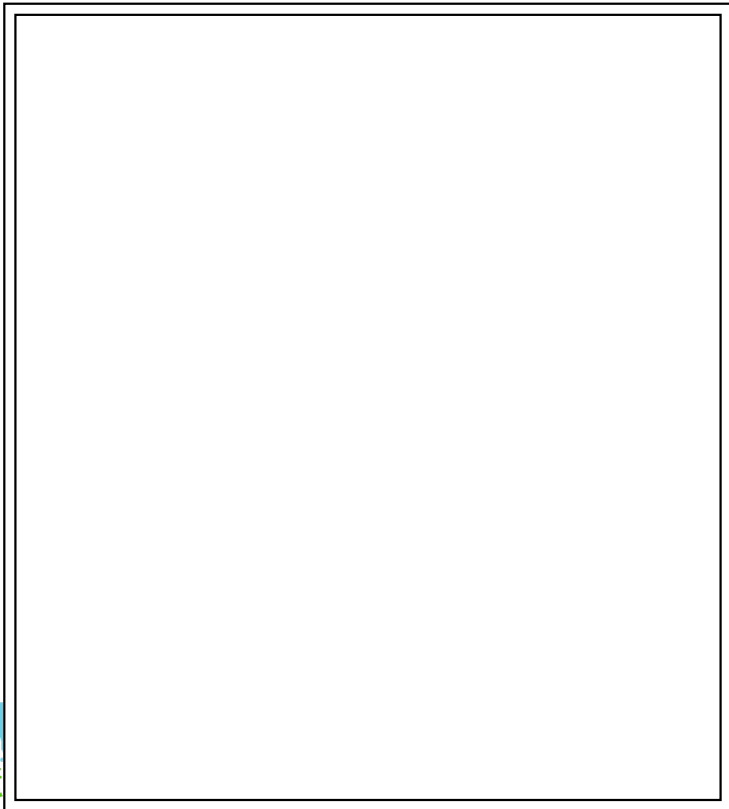
Greg and Julieann went to Siberia with their two young sons in 1994 to work among an Unreached People Group (UPG) in that remote, frozen land. They established a church plant that has grown over the years into a network of churches. Greg is part of a leadership team that strategically focuses on other unreached people groups across the Asian regions in places that are not open to normal mission efforts.

The goal in each location is to establish a locally led, self-sustaining church movement that will bear witness to the gospel within that culture. The Rujak Bible translation is for one of those UPGs. While Rujak is not their real name, this group includes over 500,000 people and only .07% of this population is considered Christian.

# Music and Hymns



## **"O God Beyond All Praising"**

This hymn really shows the true meaning of praise and worship. One large part of the praise and worship we do at church is singing. We lift up our voices to the Lord to praise and honor Him. This hymn also mentions that we marvel at His beauty, honor and adore Him, and triumph through our sorrows by offering praise through both the good and bad times. How do you praise Him?

## **"Spirit of the Living God"**

These words are sung as a prayer to the third person of the Trinity - God's Holy Spirit. There are echoes of many scriptures in this hymn, specifically from David's prayer in Psalm 51, when he prays "let the bones you have broken rejoice...create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me". He says God broke his bones! That seems like a strange thing for God to do, but the scriptures tell us that He disciplines those He loves (Hebrews 12:6). When the Lord disciplines us in a way that hurts, He does it so that we grow in a better more beautiful and holy way, instead of growing up crooked. In this song when we sing "Break me! Melt me! Mold me! Fill me!", that's what we're asking - that the Lord would take away all that is crooked and sinful in our hearts, and re-grow those parts so that they are pure and honoring to Him.
