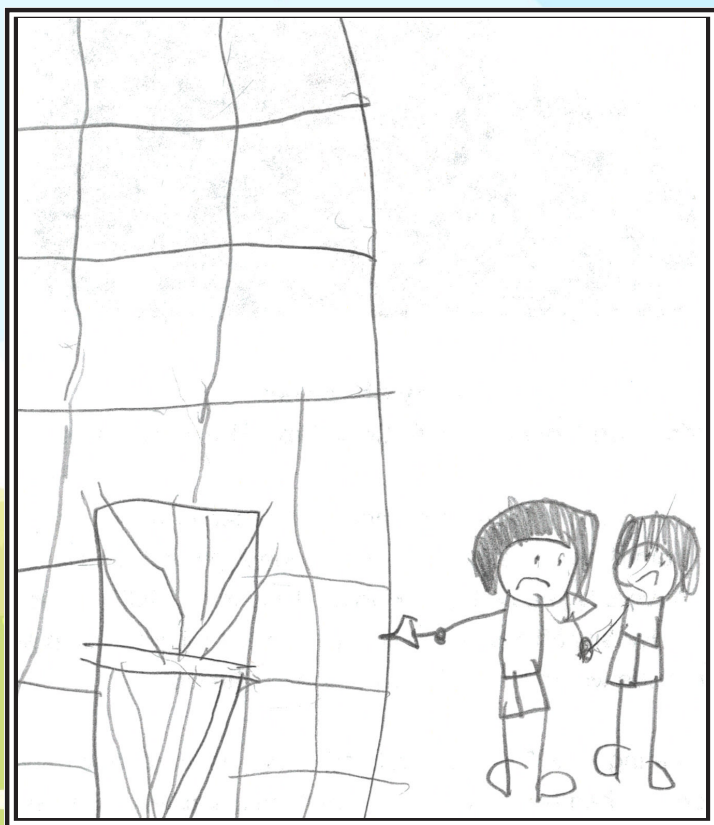

A GUIDE TO *Family Worship*

"Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth! I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old, things that we have heard and know, that our fathers have told us. We will not hide them from their children, but tell them to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done." Psalm 78:4



Parents, you have the joyful responsibility to teach the next generation the glorious deeds of the Lord. Use this list as a simple guide to help your family worship time.

1. Try to gather once a day as a family. Try to make it the same time and place every day.
2. It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
3. Read scripture from the Bible, sing a song or two, pray. Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
4. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
5. Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
6. Additional options: read a devotion or Bible story book in addition to scripture, read through a particular book of the Bible and work your way through the entire Bible, take prayer request or take turns praying, review memory work and catechism questions.
7. Parents, pray this over your children:

The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace. Numbers 6:24-26

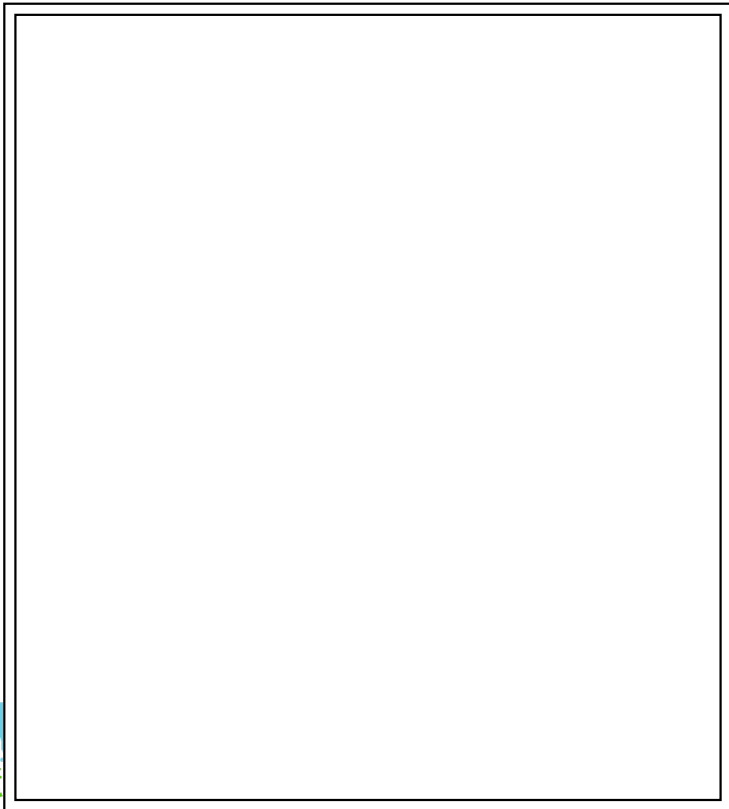
George and Phaedra Tolia

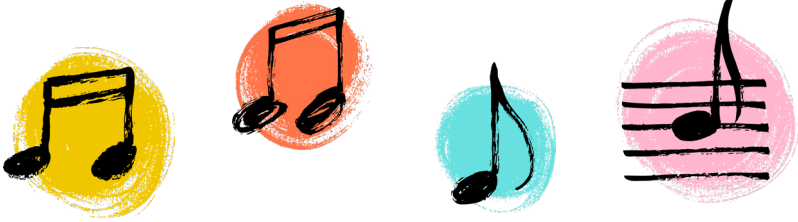

“A Mighty Fortress is Our God”

God is indeed a mighty fortress! Do you know what a fortress is? A fortress is a safe place that protects those who are inside. You can imagine a castle with high walls and a moat surrounding it, with guards and cannons ready to defend it at the first sign of an enemy. God is our fortress. Psalm 18:2 says, “The Lord is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold.” If you are in the Lord, nothing can harm you. The Lord will keep you safe. As a Christian, you are a son or daughter of the King of Kings, and you remain safe within His fortress. Praise God!

“The Church’s One Foundation”

This hymn also speaks of the church as a city with a foundation built on Christ the Lord. What else do you see the church compared to in verse 1 of this hymn? Verse 2 tells us how the elect are one people bound by one holy name, one holy food, and one hope, even though we might live all over the world. Verse 3 tells how the world views the church and describes the hardships we, the saints, must endure, but then assures us we, the church, shall never perish!
