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# A GUIDE TO *Family Worship*

*"Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth! I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old, things that we have heard and know, that our fathers have told us. We will not hide them from their children, but tell them to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done." Psalm 78:4*



Parents, you have the joyful responsibility to teach the next generation the glorious deeds of the Lord. Use this list as a simple guide to help your family worship time.

1. Try to gather once a day as a family. Try to make it the same time and place every day.
2. It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
3. Read scripture from the Bible, sing a song or two, pray. Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
4. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
5. Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
6. Additional options: read a devotion or Bible story book in addition to scripture, read through a particular book of the Bible and work your way through the entire Bible, take prayer request or take turns praying, review memory work and catechism questions.
7. Parents, pray this over your children:

*The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace. Numbers 6:24-26*

## **Jonah**

### **Sensitive Location**

The work of Jonah is so sensitive that we cannot share his actual name, location, or photograph. His Muslim country is ranked within the top five of all nations for extreme religious persecution against Christians. Radical factions are the most visible threat, but the most common source of danger for a convert is their own family. Conversion from Islam is seen as a cause for shame and blasphemy. Despite this hostility, the Church exists and even meets regularly and openly in some places, although covertly in others. Jonah fills preaching, teaching, and discipleship roles and travels frequently to meet with churches and groups of believers.

# Music and Hymns



## **“God Rest Ye Merry, Gentlemen”**

The first verse reminds us as Christians not to feel hopeless and worry about things, for Christ was born to save us from Satan's power! The rest of the hymn tells the Christmas story of the angel appearing to the shepherds in the field, telling them not to fear, and the shepherd's response; that is, they immediately went to Bethlehem to see and worship Jesus. We need to be like those shepherds at Christmas—in bold confidence, approaching Christ to worship and adore Him. “Tidings of comfort and joy” means “good news to comfort us and give us much to be joyful about!”

## **“Gentle Mary Laid Her Child”**

Can you imagine the night Jesus was born? Mary, tired and dirty, laid baby Jesus in a manger. A manger is a place where animal food is stored. Why would the King of Kings and Lord of Lords allow Himself to be born in a barn and placed in a feeding trough? The only explanation is that He wanted the world to know that He had come to the earth as a humble servant who would give His life for every single person, rich or poor. He also wants us to know that riches and splendor mean nothing in this life. He is what is truly important!
