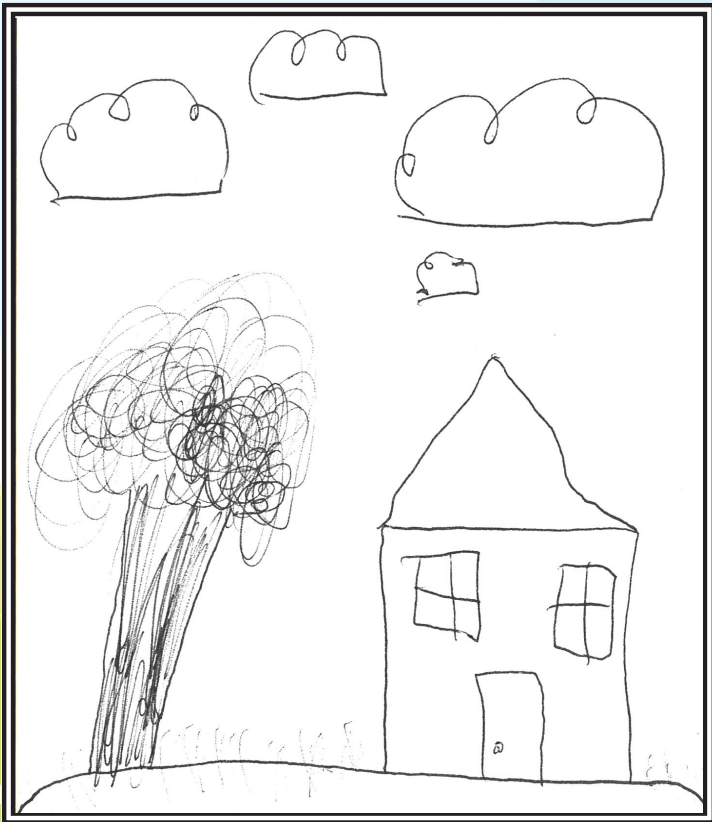

A GUIDE TO *Family Worship*

"Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth! I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old, things that we have heard and know, that our fathers have told us. We will not hide them from their children, but tell them to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done." Psalm 78:4



Parents, you have the joyful responsibility to teach the next generation the glorious deeds of the Lord. Use this list as a simple guide to help your family worship time.

1. Try to gather once a day as a family. Try to make it the same time and place every day.
2. It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
3. Read scripture from the Bible, sing a song or two, pray. Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
4. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
5. Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
6. Additional options: read a devotion or Bible story book in addition to scripture, read through a particular book of the Bible and work your way through the entire Bible, take prayer request or take turns praying, review memory work and catechism questions.
7. Parents, pray this over your children:

The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace. Numbers 6:24-26

Kate and NoNo Beale
Isaiah 55 • Reynosa, Mexico

Nolton (NoNo) and Kate Beale have been serving as missionaries in Mexico since 1999. They have been with Isaiah 55 Ministries in Reynosa, Mexico, which sits on the Texas/Mexico border, since 2005. NoNo serves as the Executive Director, and he and Kate both serve as leaders for their team of 14 missionaries. Isaiah 55 works to spread the gospel to the deaf and disenfranchised people in the city of Reynosa through evangelism, education, church planting, and community development ministries. Kate and NoNo have a strong call to the nurturing, care, and equipping of the 155 missionaries, helping them to reach their potential and fulfill their individual calling in a healthy and sustainable way. They also feel called to nurture and care for those nationals who partner with I55 through employment so that they realize the unique call God has placed on their lives and understand that they are a vital part of this ministry. The Beales are originally from Montgomery, Alabama. They have two married children, four grandchildren, and one granddaughter. They have 2 married children, 4 grandsons and one granddaughter.

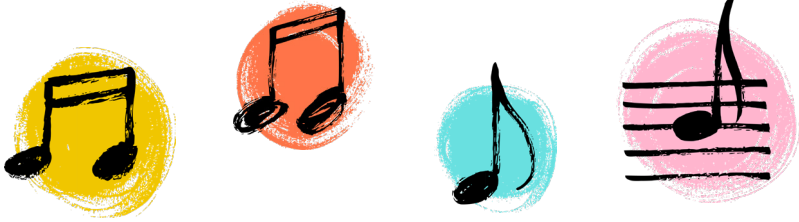

Music and Hymns



“O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing”

This hymn is about praising our Lord for the many things He does for us, such as taking away our sins, sorrows, and fears. Charles Wesley wrote this hymn in the 1700s after a bout of illness made him doubt God. He began to read the Bible, and the words gave him peace, and his faith was restored. Charles wrote this hymn eleven years after his conversion, and he recommended it as a hymn for others to sing on the anniversaries of their conversions. Have you ever thought of celebrating the anniversary of your salvation—the anniversary of giving your life to Christ? What song would you choose to praise Him on your conversion anniversary?

“O Church, Arise”

This song is calling Christians to put on the armor of God—the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the sword of the spirit, the helmet of salvation, the shield of faith, and feet prepared with the gospel of peace—to fight evil and stand up for Jesus. The armor is not physical, but spiritual. God gives us these things to protect us, and we can always have them by simply praying for them. Are you ready to rise up for Jesus?
