

Family Worship

"Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth! I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old, things that we have heard and know, that our fathers have told us. We will not hide them from their children, but tell them to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done." Psalm 78:4



Parents, you have the joyful responsibility to teach the next generation the glorious deeds of the Lord. Use this list as a simple guide to help your family worship time.

- 1. Try to gather once a day as a family. Try to make it the same time and place every day.
- 2. It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
- 3. Read scripture from the Bible, sing a song or two, pray. Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
- 4. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- 5. Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- 6. Additional options: read a devotion or Bible story book in addition to scripture, read through a particular book of the Bible and work your way through the entire Bible, take prayer request or take turns praying, review memory work and catechism questions.
- 7. Parents, pray this over your children:

The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace. Numbers 6:24-26


Tim and Kristy Holliday Isaiah 55 Reynosa, Mexico

Tim and Kristy serve with Mission to the World at Isaiah 55 Ministries in Reynosa, Mexico where they work to share the gospel among the residents of their historically underserved neighborhood, as well as support the work of the Instituto Isaías 55 School for the Deaf. At Isaiah 55, Tim currently serves as Vocational Ministries Director, coordinating vocational training and production activities. Kristy serves as the coordinator for neighborhood outreach ministries for children, youth, and adults, and also coordinates short-term volunteer mission trips to Isaiah 55. Mostly, their heart is to serve in whatever capacity the ministry requires. Their desire is to live as described by Micah 6:8- "He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

Music and Hymns









"Alleluia! Alleluia!"

Christopher Wordsworth, a nephew of the 18th-century English poet William Wordsworth, was born in 1807 and educated at Cambridge University, receiving high honors for his academic accomplishments. He was known throughout England as an outstanding scholar, tireless worker, and prolific writer. Among his writings is a collection of 127 hymns published in a hymnal in 1862 called The Holy Year. These hymns were written by Wordsworth to illustrate his conviction that hymns should not deal with personal, individual interests but rather should teach the truths of Scripture and voice the worship of the entire congregation. He also believed it was the first duty of the hymnwriter to teach sound doctrine to believers and to reach the unsaved with the gospel. This hymn is based on a verse from 1 Corinthians 15 that says, "Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep." In it, honor is given to Christ, who was the first to have victory over the grave and who will, at his second coming, give victory over death to all believers.

"O God Beyond All Praising"

This hymn really shows the true meaning of praise and worship. One large part of the praise and worship we do at church is singing. We lift up our voices to the Lord to praise and honor Him. This hymn also mentions that we marvel at His beauty, honor and adore Him, and triumph through our sorrows by offering praise through both the good and bad times. How do you praise Him?
