

Family Worship

"Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth! I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old, things that we have heard and know, that our fathers have told us. We will not hide them from their children, but tell them to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done." Psalm 78:4



Parents, you have the joyful responsibility to teach the next generation the glorious deeds of the Lord. Use this list as a simple guide to help your family worship time.

- 1. Try to gather once a day as a family. Try to make it the same time and place every day.
- 2. It does not have to be long; it does not have to be perfect.
- 3. Read scripture from the Bible, sing a song or two, pray. Pray for the children; pray for missionaries; pray for Trinity Church; give thanks.
- 4. Everyone tell one thing they are thankful for.
- 5. Have a Leader of the Day: they get to read and/or pray and/or tell everyone to come gather and/or put out the Bibles/hymnals and/or tell something that happened to them that day.
- 6. Additional options: read a devotion or Bible story book in addition to scripture, read through a particular book of the Bible and work your way through the entire Bible, take prayer request or take turns praying, review memory work and catechism questions.
- 7. Parents, pray this over your children:

The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you the LORD lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace. Numbers 6:24-26


Montgomery, Alabama

"Jesus Paid It All"

There's a lot in the Bible about sharing and loving others. Do your mom and dad ever remind you to share with your friends or your siblings? Well, this song is about even more than sharing. The words in this song ask God to 'take' everything. Wow! They ask God to take every part of us—our hands, feet, voice, mind, heart, life, money, and our whole selves. Does God really ask that of us? Yes, He does. He says if we want to follow Him, He has to be the ruler of every single thing in our lives. That might seem like a hard thing to do, and sometimes it is super hard. But this song reminds us that we only have these things because God gave them to us anyway. And when He takes all of these things, He makes them all brand new, perfect, and beautiful, and He fills our hearts with joy! You can sing this song as a prayer to our great God. Remember, we're not sharing with Him in this song; we're asking Him to take everything.

"Like a River Glorious"
